6. FY2026-28 Technology Project Proposals Presentations (Discussion Item)

Department of Public Health (DPH)

Presenter(s): Elizabeth Kreuger

Project: eCMS Implementation

Overview: Subcommittee members asked about engagement with the Office of Contract Administration, whether the system was limited to the public health context, whether alternative City contracting solutions were evaluated, and anticipated time savings. The Department of Public Health clarified that it collaborated on contract templates and terms and conditions; that the system is contract-specific, not discipline-specific; that an exploratory assessment was conducted post-COVID and no contract lifecycle management system was in place as of a year ago; and that the proposed system is expected to eliminate significant process inefficiencies.

Project: Cloud 2030

Overview: Subcommittee members asked whether the proposed project management allocation would be sufficient to meet projected timelines, how COIT-funded positions are incorporated into the rate model, and whether departments would be required to establish interdepartmental service agreements. The Department of Technology clarified that additional support comes from a business analyst and professional services, that COIT-funded positions are reflected as a separate line item in the budget, and that it is highly unlikely that additional funding will be requested from COIT and confirmed that all project costs should be fully funded through FY29.

Project: Emerging Technologies Update

Overview: Subcommittee members asked about the respective responsibilities for experimentation and deployment of departmental projects. The Department of Technology will lead the development of the necessary infrastructure and provide support through coaching and evaluation.

Project: Complying with California Law AB1637 for sf.gov Migration

Overview: Subcommittee members asked about the anticipated benefits of migrating to a .gov domain, the potential effects of not funding the project, how the cost scenario might change if out-of-scope departments choose to participate, and the financial and operational commitments required from departments. The Department of Technology clarified that transitioning to a .gov domain offers significant value in terms of branding, credibility, and public trust. The project would need to be paused without additional funding, the cost scenario would not change if out-of-scope departments opt in because those departments are managing separate discussions, and departments would need to dedicate staff time to support testing and validation in the new environment.

Department of Technology (TIS)

Project: Reducing Life Safety Risk for City Offices

Overview: Subcommittee members asked about the level of demand from departments for this service, its anticipated impact on staff, and the project's projected end state. The Department of Technology clarified that the proposed solution was developed in response to a recent incident in which members of the public gained unauthorized access to City Hall and that the initial implementation is expected to benefit approximately 9000 employees. Integrating an identity governance platform with external badging systems will enable faster response times and strengthen overall access control.

Department of Technology (TIS)

Presenter(s): Gene Villaflores

Project: Increase City Data Center Resiliency

Overview: Subcommittee members asked about the relationship between this project and Cloud 2030, and whether it would impact the setup at Rancho. The Department of Technology clarified that the data center serves as the primary location for core infrastructure, and that a secondary site outside of DT is necessary to ensure continuity of operations in the event of an incident.
