Members of the public may address the DJJ Realignment Subcommittee (“Committee”) for up to three (3) minutes on any matter within the Committee’s jurisdiction. The Committee will hear public comment on all agenda items before, or during discussion of, the item. The members will also hear public comments on items not listed (see Agenda, Item 2).

The period of time allowed for public comment may be modified by the Chair in the interest of fairness to all those wishing to address the Committee. Speakers shall address their remarks to the Committee as a whole and not to individual members or Department personnel. The lack of a response by the members or department personnel does not necessarily constitute agreement with, or support of, statements made during public comment.

Public Comment may be made:

This ordinance assures that deliberations are conducted before the people and that City operations are open to the people's review. JJCC & DJJ Realignment Subcommittee procedures do not permit:

- Signs to be brought into the meeting or displayed in the meeting room.
