PSAB Review of Policy

- Approved for COIT review at March 31st 2022 meeting
- Motion requested that SFPD:
 - Amend policy to prohibit live monitoring of cameras within private residences
 - Consider clarifying the use case circumstances in response to the letter submitted to COIT on March 30th by Electronic Frontier Foundation & ACLU of Northern CA

Non-City Entity Surveillance Camera Overview

- Any camera owned by a non-City entity, including but not limited to Residential, Small Business, & Commercial Security Camera Systems
- Data provided to SFPD either through consent of camera owner, subpoena or search warrant
- Policy excludes any cameras that are both paid for with City grant funds and contractually obligated to share data with any City department

Authorized Uses

- 1. Temporary live monitoring during active criminal investigations and significant events with public safety concerns. Temporary live monitoring will cease within 24 hours after the request to the non-city entity is approved and the non-city entity has provided access to SFPD.
- Reviewing specific historical video footage to aid a criminal or internal investigation.

Amended Prohibition

SFPD is prohibited from live monitoring inside residential dwellings where homeowners/renters have a reasonable expectation of privacy unless one the following conditions exist, exigency per SF Admin Code 19b.7; a homeowner/renter/individual with legal authority to consent, consents, or a warrant is issued.
