PEM Pearls

This week's PEM Pearl centers on logistics. One of the most interesting parts of my role as co-medical director of PEM is looking into cases and identifying systems-level challenges that we can address to improve the quality of care we deliver.

After review of recent cases, I have a few important updates to share with folx:

- Have a low threshold to reach out to BCH pediatric subspecialties early via the BCH Access Center (415-353-1611) when caring for children with complex surgical or medical histories, previously or currently cared for by these teams. These teams can help guide care and support the decisionmaking surrounding the need for transfer.
- MRI A/P is available 24/7 for pediatric appendicitis! If you encounter pushback or challenges from radiology, please let me know. (For reference, <u>here</u> is our pathway-- pending an edit for transfer ≤ 8yo and changing verbiage to "nondiagnostic ultrasound")
- When transferring a pediatric patient, please make sure to give the inpatient peds attending (69846) a heads up (we're updating this pathway to be more clear)
- When caring for a pediatric patient with a concern related to sexual assault or sexual abuse, first contact is the RTC/CASARC pager: 415-327-1191. We're updating E*Drive to reflect this.
