PUBLIC COMMENT INFORMATION

Members of the public may address the Commission for up to three minutes on any matter within the Commission's jurisdiction. The Commission will hear public comment on all agenda items before, or during discussion of, the item. The Commission will also hear public comments on items not listed (see Agenda, Item 2).

The period of time allowed for public comment may be modified by the Chair in the interest of fairness to all those wishing to address the Commission. Speakers shall address their remarks to the Commission as a whole and not to individual Commissioners or Department personnel. The lack of a response by the Commissioners or Department personnel does not necessarily constitute agreement with, or support of, statements made during public comment.

Public comment may be made:

- 1) In person at the meeting.
- 2) By email to JUV-ProbationCommission@sfgov.org if received no later than 12:00 pm the Tuesday before the meeting.
- 3) By leaving voicemail at 415-271-2861. Comments submitted no later than 12:00 pm the Tuesday before the meeting will be read into the record during the meeting and will be treated as a substitute to providing public comment during the meeting.

NOTE: Persons who submit by written public comment or by voice mail in advance on an agenda item will not be permitted to also provide public comment on the same agenda item(s) in-person during the meeting.

Instructions for Public Comment Callers

*Public Comment can be made by phone during the virtual meeting:

1. Call 415-655-0001, enter Access Code 2662 427 1723, then press “#” when asked for ID, and press “#” again.

- To make comment, press *3 (star, three) to raise your hand.
- You will hear a prompt confirming that your hand has been raised.
- Please wait until the Host unmutes you and allows you to speak.
- When it is your turn, you will hear a prompt saying, "You have been unmuted," and you may begin your comment.
- Please speak only to the entire Council and not to individual members.
- You will have **3-minutes** to make your public comment.

DISABILITY ACCESS & ACCOMMODATION

City Hall Room 408 is wheelchair accessible. Remote public participation is available upon request for individuals who cannot attend in person due to disability. Making a request to participate remotely no later than one (1) hour prior to the start of the meeting helps ensure availability of the meeting link.

Sign Language Interpretation is also available upon request. If requesting remote Sign Language Interpretation, please submit an accommodation request a minimum of 4-business hours prior to the start of the meeting.

Wheelchair-accessible entrances are located on Van Ness Avenue and Grove Street. Please note the wheelchair lift at the Goodlett Place/Polk Street is temporarily not available. After multiple repairs that were followed by additional breakdowns, the wheelchair lift at the Goodlett/Polk entrance is being replaced for improved operation and reliability. We anticipate having a functioning lift after the completion of construction in May 2025. There are elevators and accessible restrooms located on every floor.

Allowing a minimum of 48-business hours for all other accommodation requests helps ensure availability.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS UNDER THE SUNSHINE ORDINANCE

Government's duty is to serve the public, reaching its decision in full view of the public.
