 Please wear your mask around other staff and always use minimum PPE required for patient contact (N95 and eye protection)


## **SELF-SCREENING**

#### PEM PEARL

Anyone who's spent at least 3 minutes with him knows that Dr. Colwell is a huge fan of **droperidol**. A <u>brand new review</u> discusses the use of droperidol for **pediatric agitation**, and found several things:

- Very high success rate
- Dosing: 1-10 mg, with average dosing 0.14 mg/kg
  - Most doses were administered IM
- o Time to sedation: roughly 10-15 min, with many sooner
- Duration of effective sedation: roughly 30-60 min (most patients required only one dose)
- No arrhythmias; only long QTc was in a patient with concomitant ingestion and no arrhythmia occurred
- Dystonia in 2.5%, all resolved with diphenhydramine

SO-- from existing literature, it appears as if droperidol is safe for use in pediatric agitation. I recommend collaboration with ED pharmacy when available to decide on appropriate dosing. LMK how it goes the next time you try it out!
