Following the review of surveillance technology policies and impact reports of security cameras owned and operated by City departments, the Privacy and Surveillance Advisory Board (PSAB) identified a number of departments with agreements to shared security camera footage. Government's duty is to serve the public, reaching its decisions in full view of the public. Commissions, boards, councils and other agencies of the City and County exist to conduct the people's business. This ordinance assures that deliberations are conducted before the people and that City operations are open to the people's review.
