6) **FOR ACTION:** **REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF A NEW AGREEMENT WITH WESTSIDE COMMUNITY SERVICES TO PROVIDE TARGETED, SHORT-TERM INTERVENTIONS TO INDIVIDUALS RESIDING IN RESPITE BEDS AT THE ELEANORA FAGAN CENTER. THE TOTAL PROPOSED AGREEMENT AMOUNT IS \$7,774,934 WHICH INCLUDES A 12% CONTINGENCY FOR THE TERM OF 6/2/2025 THROUGH 6/30/2026 (1 YEAR AND 1 MONTH).**

The Eleanora Fagan Center located at the Kean Hotel, 1018 Mission Street, San Francisco 94103 will provide short-term (30-60 day) health respite beds for unhoused adults beginning their recovery. This will include help with urgent health issues, behavioral health support, and treatment for substance use. Once stabilized, case managers will assist the resident in taking the next steps in their recovery including connecting them to longer-term treatment, community living, or supportive housing.

In compliance with Chapter 79 of the San Francisco Administrative Code and the Department of Public Health's "Good Neighbor Policy," notice of the Health Commission's intent to approve this program was posted over thirty days prior to this date.

- 7) **FOR ACTION:** **REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF A NEW PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE SALVATION ARMY TO PERFORM RECOVERY HOUSING FOR PEOPLE LEAVING RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE USE TREATMENT. THE TOTAL PROPOSED AGREEMENT AMOUNT IS \$8,212,949 WHICH INCLUDES A 12% CONTINGENCY FOR THE TERM OF 07/01/2025 THROUGH 06/30/2027 (2 YEARS).**

The Marina Inn Housing Program located at the Marina Inn, 3110 Octavia Street, San Francisco 94123, is designed to provide participants with a structured, supportive environment to rebuild their lives. The program will help individuals maintain their sobriety after completing treatment, with a strong emphasis on personal accountability, responsibility, and community engagement. The goal is to support each participant in their journey toward lasting recovery while ensuring they have the tools, support, and opportunities to build a brighter future. Residents will be provided with onsite case management and wraparound support for workforce development, financial planning, and family reunification. The program includes work requirements, background checks, random drug testing, a daily curfew, and requires all participants to save money towards their next step of independent living.

In compliance with Chapter 79 of the San Francisco Administrative Code and the Department of Public Health's "Good Neighbor Policy," notice of the Health Commission's intent to approve this program was posted over thirty days prior to this date.

2. **Request for approval of a New Grant Agreement with Code Tenderloin (Fiscal Sponsor Center for New Music San Francisco, INC.) to provide Community Holistic Overdose Prevention Programs (CHOPP) in San Francisco. The total proposed agreement amount is \$5,159,243 which includes a 12% contingency for the term of 5/1/2025 through 4/30/2030 (5 years).**
3. **Request for approval of a New Grant Agreement with Homeless Children's Network (HCN) to provide the Community Holistic Overdose Prevention Program (CHOPP). The total proposed agreement amount is \$3,095,400 which includes a 12% contingency for the term of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2029 (5 years).**

The total proposed agreement amount is \$3,952,480 which includes a 12% contingency for the term of 9/1/2024 through 8/31/2026 (2 years).

Request for approval of a New Professional Services Agreement with Regents of the University of California, Children and Adolescent Services to develop workforce capacity across the Children, Youth, & Families System of Care in delivering two evidence-based treatment models. The total proposed agreement amount is \$1,380,075 which includes a 12% contingency for the term of 09/26/2024 through 06/30/2026 (1 year and 7 months).
7. Request for approval of a New Professional Services Agreement with Homeless Children's Network's Youth Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Programs. The total proposed agreement amount is \$8,960,000 which includes a 12% contingency for the term of October 1, 2024 through June 30, 2028 (3.75 years).
