He broke the trust of his constituents.</p> <p>On the last possible day, Joel Engardio placed Prop K on a city-wide ballot. He did not listen to Sunset residents. He held zero listening sessions. When residents and small businesses asked him to rescind Prop K, Engardio doubled down. He never apologized or acknowledged his mistake.
