Re: Public Hearing on Proposed Street Changes Treasure Island & Yerba Buena Island- Parking Meters

Dear Decision-makers,

I'm a 26 resident of Treasure Island and have been recognized by the Treasure Island Development Authority Board as an advocate for our majority minority low income community.

In 2016, I first expressed my criticisms of the Transportation Demand Management program for the Treasure Island Project (the Project) in comments at the first Treasure Island Mobility Management Agency Board Meeting. The Project is now well underway with two affordable TIDA buildings and three developer buildings (one nearly) completed and partly occupied. Unfortunately, many of the equity issues I raised in 2016 have still not been properly addressed.

I believe that the TDM parking policies will have disproportionate and adverse economic and social impacts on low and moderate households who need to drive, and have already moved to the two TIDA buildings-- Maceo May and Starview Court-- as well as for off-island visitors, such as family members, caregivers, etc., even for visitors of the non-driving households.

The TDM program planned for roughly 15% to 20% fewer parking spaces than needed, with the intent to discourage use of private vehicles, creating a system of 'scarcity by design'. The added cost of the congestion tax combine with the lack of affordable parking is intended to make private vehicle use prohibitively expensive, which raises the issue of Environmental Justice for these low and moderate households.

According to the SFCTA 2014 TI Transporation Survey, while 60% "of TI residents reported taking transit for on/off island trips", at least 73% of TI residents drive off-island three times or more each week, with 39% driving daily. Extrapolating from a SFCTA graph in their congestion toll presentation, I estimated that the toll would increase total transportation spending by the low-income households in the TI Project who needed to drive-- comprising at least 2/3 of all low-income TI households-- by more than 90%. I also estimated that the cost of parking in the TI Project will add roughly 54% in costs, so the total projected increase in transportation spending for low- income households will be 144%, or nearly 35% of median household income.

The proposed street changes for all Project streets is for metered parking from 9am to 10 pm every day. A parking space in the nearby temporary parking lot costs \$250 monthly, while the few spaces in the TIDA buildings are allocated by lottery. However, these households all moved from units that had assigned (free) parkings spaces, and there was also (free) street parking nearby.

These extra parking costs may cause them to be ticketed and towed into debt. As a result, many will be forced to move off Treasure Island, which, in effect, may amount to constructive eviction.

However, almost all of these households were already living on Treasure Island in the interim housing project, and many of them were in a federally funded program to help the homeless, and almost all of

them recieved 120 Day Notices to vacate their units. Consequently, all of these displaced households are entitled to comparable replacement housing under federal, state, and CCSF relocation law.

While the stated motive of the TDM program is to achieve a "50% mode shift" to transit, alledgedly with the goal of reducing congestion and greenhouse gases in accordance with AB32, the true motive appears to save the Project developers from having to pay an additional \$5 million for transit.

I've searched the Development Agreement between the City and County of San Francisco and Treasure Island Community Development, LLC [TICD] related to Treasure Island/Yerba Buena Island, and also AB981, the Treasure Island Transportation Management Act, which added Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 1967) to Division 2.5 of the Streets and Highways Code, relating to transportation, but I could not find any mention of this supposed "requirement" for a 50% transit share.

I also read Exhibit N. Transportation Plan Obligations, contained in the Disposition and Development Agreement between Treasure Island Development Authority [TIDA] and TICD (the DDA), and found a paragraph at the bottom of page 2 with the heading "Additional Transportation Subsidy", which states:

Developer shall pay TITMA [now called TIMMA] an additional transportation subsidy in the total amount of \$5 million...if the transit report required to be prepared within one year after the first certificate of occupancy is issued for the 4,000th dwelling unit on the Project Site...shows residential transit mode share is 50% or less.

According to the SFCTA's own 2014 Survey, 37% of TI households had already gone "car free"-compared to 31% for SF residents-- which even exceeded TIMMA's ambitious goal of 30% for TI Project residents-- while TI residents had already shifted to transit at a much higher rate than SF residents-- 60% vs. 34%-- and at a higher rate than the SFCTA CHAMP computer model predicted even under the most punitive toll scenario, Scenario 4.

To put this mode-shift achievement by existing TI residents in perspective, I refer you to a 2004 paper by Loren Rice for the Public Policy Institute of California titled "Transportation Spending by Low-Income California Households: Lessons for the Bay Area", which points out that:

Only 14 percent of the low-income population in the Bay Area use transit to get to work, whereas 53 percent drive alone, and another 17 percent carpool (Table 5.1). This means that a transportation affordability strategy that focuses solely on transit-oriented policies will likely affect less than half of the population of interest. A comprehensive approach to transportation affordability in the Bay Area must deal with the reality that most low-income households rely extensively on automobiles. [page 114]

Therefore, I implore you as decision-makers to reconsider these proposed street changes and avoid doing irreparable harm to many of these low and moderate income SF residents in the TI Project.



Sneak peek: Treasure Island's first major park set to open, with sweeping S.F. skyline views

When the Golden Gate International Exposition opened on Treasure Island in 1939, a major feature was the "Magic Carpet" of flowering ice plant, a dense strip of purples and pinks that stretched out along the shoreline facing the twinkling city across the bay.

That spectacular field, replete with more than 1 million blooms in 23 varieties, according to a Chronicle report at the time, was replaced by grass, pavement and a chapel when the world's fair closed in 1940 and the U.S. Navy took over.

But 85 years later, the Magic Carpet motif is back as the theme of Cityside Park, a public promenade along Treasure Island's west shore facing San Francisco's soaring skyline. The first 6 acres of what will eventually be a 24-acre park will open Sept. 13.

Treasure Island Is Getting Its First Major Park, and It Will Have Food Truck Parties

SFist, September 2nd 2025

A major new SF park called Cityside Park is opening on Treasure Island next weekend, with barbecue grills and jumbo picnic tables, recurring Off the Grid food truck events, and SF views that you just can't get in SF.

San Francisco has been trying to make Treasure Island happen for a number of years, embellishing the man-made island and former World War II naval base with some new high-rise apartment buildings and a new ferry to Treasure Island. But it's still largely just a big old construction site while the new development is being built.

So the City of San Francisco is betting that maybe a new park 24-acre park on Treasure Island called Cityside Park will draw you out there, as the Chronicle reports. The first six acres of that park will open at its grand opening on Saturday, September 13, and according to the Chronicle, the park will offer views of "Coit Tower, the [Transamerica] Pyramid, the Ferry Building, the Hyatt Regency across the water in San Francisco — as well as the Bay Bridge and the Golden Gate Bridge"

The park will feature bike and hiking paths, but its most unique offering may be a set of barbecue grills that are free to use, with jumbo 20-foot picnic tables next to them.

SF: Plans Advance For \$25 Million New Marina At Treasure Island

A long-stalled plan to build a new marina at San Francisco's Treasure Island has gained momentum with the formation of a partnership that will provide capital for the \$25 million project, according to the companies involved. Interest in modernizing and expanding the moorings at Clipper Cove dates to the 1990s, when the city acquired development rights from the U.S. Navy. Negotiations with the Navy over the transfer, an

environmental review and the COVID-19 pandemic all dragged the project into the present yet to be started.

On Wednesday, the company leading the project, Kenwood Investments, announced a partnership with the current marina's manager, Suntex Marina Investors, which will provide the money needed to get the project started by next June.

Transportation Authority Secures \$16.25M for Yerba Buena Island Multiuse Pathway Project

Citizen Portal, September 9th 2025

San Francisco's Transportation Authority has taken a significant step toward enhancing connectivity with the approval of a resolution to secure \$16.25 million in funding for the Yerba Buena Island multi-use pathway. During a recent meeting, the board authorized the executive director to submit an allocation request to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) for these regional measure 3 bridge toll funds, which are crucial for the project's development.

The multi-use pathway aims to improve access between Yerba Buena Island and the Bay Bridge, facilitating safer travel for pedestrians and cyclists. This initiative is part of a broader effort to reduce congestion and enhance transportation options in the region, particularly as new housing developments increase the population on the island. The pathway will serve as a vital link, connecting residents to jobs and opportunities in San Francisco and the East Bay.

In addition to the RM3 funding, the board also approved programming \$1.37 million in Senate Bill 1 local partnership program funds to further support the project. This funding is essential for closing the financial gap and ensuring the timely progression of the pathway's construction. The project is expected to begin construction in July 2026, with design completion slated for March of the same year.

Ned Kahn's 'Canopy of Sky' Sculpture Unveiled at Treasure Island, Enhancing San Francisco's Cultural Landscape

Hoodline, September 15th 2025

Treasure Island's Cityside Park just got a little more enchanting. Renowned artist Ned Kahn has unveiled his latest creation, 'Canopy of Sky,' a kinetic sculpture that plays with the island's natural elements of fog and wind. Imagine seeing 7,000 translucent polycarbonate discs dancing overhead, and you've got the idea.

The San Francisco Arts Commission announced the new public art, noting Kahn's dedication to materials that will brave the maritime conditions: stainless steel, aluminum, and those fluttering polycarbonate discs. The entire contraption is suspended 15 feet up, so it'll be hard to miss when strolling through the park. The president of the Treasure Island Development Authority Board of Directors, Fei Tsen, looks forward to this artwork shaping the island's identity.

"Public art is about creating an experience that engage the senses, spark curiosity, and connects people to the environment where that artwork is sited," Ralph Remington, Director of Cultural Affairs, stated, per the San Francisco Arts Commission. He believes that Kahn's sculpture has nailed these goals, expecting it to inspire visitors for years to come. The 'Canopy of Sky' joins another significant art piece, Hiroshi Sugimoto's 'Point of Infinity,' in elevating the cultural landscape of Treasure Island.

Public Art: Sargent Johnson left a legacy in the Bay Area

Some of San Francisco's most famous murals — like the ones at Coit Tower or the Beach Chalet — came from the New Deal era in the 1930s.
