- **Subject:** Resolution Retroactively Approving and Authorizing the Execution of a First Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement between the Treasure Island Development Authority and Toolworks Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit corporation, commencing on October 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, to increase the annual Scope of Services and not to exceed Contract Amount for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 (Action Item)

#### BACKGROUND

On June 8, 2022, the Treasure Island Development Authority (the "Authority") Board of Directors approved a Professional Services Agreement (the "Agreement") with Toolworks Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit corporation ("Toolworks"), to provide training and employment opportunities for economically-disadvantaged people. For over twenty-four years, Toolworks has been providing janitorial services to the Treasure Island Development Authority ("Authority") through its janitorial division. Trainees are recruited through the One Treasure Island Job Broker Program and through the Homeless Employment Collaborative. Toolworks has developed a specific training program for Treasure Island that utilizes one fulltime supervisor. This person trains and supervises the work of four trainees who work up to five hours a day, five days a week for 10 weeks. The trainees are then assisted in finding fulltime janitorial jobs. Toolworks gives priority placement in this program to Treasure Island residents.

Under the existing Agreement, Toolworks provides annual janitorial services to (i) the Administration Building facility which consist of TIDA's Project Office and all Administration Building occupants, except the US Navy and the San Francisco Police Department; (ii) Buildings 201 (TI Nurses Clinic), 264, and 502 (Childcare Facility); (iii) Mersea Restaurant Bathrooms / Northern Great Lawn Area; (iv) Vista Point / Quarters 9; and (v) Quarters 1-6. The San Francisco County Transportation Authority ("SFCTA") in cooperation with the Bay Area Toll Authority ("BATA") was responsible for construction of the Vista Point facility located at Quarters 9 and Pier E2 (both located on Yerba Buena Island), including operations, maintenance, and security services. The Authority is assisting SFCTA with Vista Point and Pier E2 operations including providing landscape, janitorial and security services utilizing its existing providers, including rental of a restroom trailer that services Vista Point and Quarter 9. SFCTA reimburses the Authority for all expenses related to these services on a semi-annual basis.

In an effort to further simplify reimbursement processing from SFCTA, Toolworks has agreed to incorporate the existing Vista Point restroom rental into their Professional Services Agreement.

Project Staff and Toolworks have negotiated a First Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement (the "First Amendment") that includes expenses related to renting the existing restroom trailer facility at Quarters 9 in an amount not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for the period from October 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

## PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The salient terms and conditions of the proposed First Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement include the following:

Compensation:	Total compensation for all services under the Professional Services Agreement shall not exceed three hundred and forty-six thousand dollars (\$343,000.00) for Fiscal Year 2022-23.

## **BUDGET IMPACT**

The First Amendment provides Toolworks with an amount not to exceed \$343,000.00 during FY 2022-2023. This amount increases the level of funding for FY 2022-2023 by \$27,000.00 to address cost of renting restroom trailer at Vista Point. The First Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement presents no impact to the Authority's budget as additional expenses will be absorbed by SFCTA.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Project Staff recommends retroactive approval of the First Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement between the Treasure Island Development Authority and Toolworks, Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit corporation to increase the annual Scope of Services and not to exceed Contract Amount to \$343,000.00 for FY 2022-2023, and authorize the Treasure Island Director or his designee to execute said First Amendment subject to the additional terms and conditions set forth above.

#### FIRST AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

#### THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

(this "First Amendment"), dated for reference purposes only as of October 1, 2022, is by and between the TREASURE ISLAND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation (the "Authority"), and Toolworks, Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit corporation (the "Contractor").

#### RECITALS

**A.** The Authority and the Contractor entered into that certain Professional Services Agreement dated for reference purposes as July 1, 2022 (the "Original Agreement"), for Janitorial services within the commercial areas of Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island, as more particularly described in the Original Agreement. The term of the Original Agreement expires on June 30, 2023.

**B.** The Authority and the Contractor desire to retroactively amend the Original Agreement to update the Scope of Services and to increase the Contract Amount not to exceed the Fiscal Year amount for 2022-2023 on the terms and conditions set forth in this First Amendment.

**C.** The Original Agreement and this First Amendment shall collectively be referred to as the "Agreement". All capitalized terms used herein but not otherwise defined shall have the meaning given to them in the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and for other good and valuable consideration, the Authority and the Contractor hereby amend the Agreement as follows:

#### AGREEMENT

1. <u>Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference as if fully set forth herein.

**2.** <u>Effective Date</u>. The effective date of this First Amendment shall be October 1, 2022 (the "Effective Date").

**3.** <u>**Compensation.**</u> As of the Effective Date, the first paragraph of Section 3.3.1 of the Original Agreement shall be amended to read as follows:

"3.3.1 **Payment**. Contractor shall provide an invoice to the City on a monthly basis for Services completed in the immediate preceding month, unless a different schedule is set out in Appendix A, "Calculation of Charges / Scope of Services." Compensation shall be made for Services identified in the invoice that the Treasure Island Director, in his sole discretion, concludes has been satisfactorily performed. Payment shall be made within 30 calendar days of receipt of the invoice, unless the City notifies the Contractor that a dispute as to the invoice exists. In no event shall the amount of this Agreement exceed Three Hundred and Forty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$343,000.00).

The breakdown of charges associated with this Agreement appears in Appendix A "Calculation of Charges / Scope of Services," attached hereto and incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein. In no event shall City be liable for interest or late charges for any late payments."

**4.** <u>Appendix A</u>. As of the Effective Date. Appendix A is deleted and replaced with the attached Appendix A.

5. <u>Counterparts</u>. This First Amendment may be executed in counterparts with the same force and effect as if the parties had executed one instrument, and each such counterpart shall constitute an original hereof.

6. <u>Full Force and Effect</u>. Except as specifically amended herein, the terms and conditions of the Sublease shall remain in full force and effect.

Compensation of up to three hundred and forty-six thousand dollars (\$346,000.00) for Fiscal Year 2022-23 payable as follows: July 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022 = \$79,000.00, (three (3) monthly payments of \$26,333.33); October 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 = \$264,000.00 (nine (9) monthly payments of \$29,333.33) totaling \$343,000.00 for contract services.

- Soap, toilet paper, hand towels, seat covers for all restrooms and kitchens in all venues with the exception of roll hand towels at the Childcare Facility
- Uniform soap and paper goods dispensers for all restrooms and kitchens in all venues
- Transport of equipment and personnel
- Implantation of Composting Program for the Administration Building

## (ii) Janitorial Services for Mersea Restaurant/Northern Great Lawn Area

Toolworks to provide services daily to maintain the Northern Great Lawn Area restrooms including materials and supplies. Janitorial services to include:

Restrooms

- Sweep entrance, disinfect handrails
- Sweep and wet mop all floors
- Wipe and clean all fixtures with disinfectant
- Wipe and clean all mirrors and metal fixtures
- Fill all dispensers, paper towels, toilet paper, seat covers and soap

2 Resolution Retroactively Approving and Authorizing the Execution of a First 3 Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement between the Treasure Island 4 Development Authority and Toolworks, Inc., a California nonprofit public benefit 5 corporation, commencing on October 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, to update the 6 Scope of Services and to increase the Contract Amount not to exceed the Fiscal Year 7 amount for 2022-2023.

8 WHEREAS, Naval Station Treasure Island is a military base located on Treasure 9 Island and Yerba Buena Island (together, the "Base"), which is currently owned by the United 10 States of America ("the Federal Government"); and,

11 **WHEREAS,** The Base was selected for closure and disposition by the Base 12 Realignment and Closure Commission in 1993, acting under Public Law 101-510, and its 13 subsequent amendments; and,

WHEREAS, On May 2, 1997, the Board of Supervisors passed Resolution No. 380-97, authorizing the Mayor's Treasure Island Project Office to establish a nonprofit public benefit corporation known as the Treasure Island Development Authority (the "Authority") to act as a single entity focused on the planning, redevelopment, reconstruction, rehabilitation, reuse and conversion of the Base for the public interest, convenience, welfare and common benefit of the inhabitants of the City and County of San Francisco; and,

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WHEREAS, Under the Treasure Island Conversion Act of 1997 (the "Act"), which amended Section 33492.5 of the California Health and Safety Code and added Section 2.1 to Chapter 1333 of the Statutes of 1968, the California Legislature (i) designated the Authority as a redevelopment agency under California redevelopment law with authority over the Base upon approval of the City's Board of Supervisors, and (ii) with respect to those portions of the Base which are subject to the Tidelands Trust, vested in the Authority the authority to
 administer the public trust for commerce, navigation and fisheries as to such property; and,

WHEREAS, On February 6, 1998, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No.
 43-98 approving the designation of the Authority as a redevelopment agency for Treasure
 Island and Yerba Buena Island; and,

WHEREAS, The Authority has negotiated and endorsed a proposed Base Closure
 Homeless Assistance Agreement and Option to Lease Real Property (the "Homeless Assistance Agreement") with One Treasure Island, a consortium of California nonprofit
 corporations organized to utilize the resources of the Base to help fill gaps in the continuum of
 care for homeless persons and families, pursuant to the Base Closure Community
 Redevelopment and Homeless Assistance Act of 1994; and,

WHEREAS, In 2011, the Authority and One Treasure Island executed the Amended
 and Restated Base Closure Homeless Assistance Agreement ("Amended Homeless
 Assistance Agreement") and approved by the Board of Supervisors in Resolution no. 243-11;
 and,

17 WHEREAS, Within the Amended Homeless Assistance Agreement is the Jobs and 18 Equal Opportunity Program ("JEOP") which describes job training and employment 19 opportunities for One Treasure Island's member organizations for formerly homeless and 20 economically disadvantaged San Franciscans; and,

WHEREAS, The Authority wishes to support One Treasure Island pursuant to the Base
 Closure Community Redevelopment, Homeless Assistance Act of 1994, and Amended
 Homeless Assistance Agreement; and,

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1 **WHEREAS,** Toolworks, Inc. a California nonprofit corporation ("Toolworks"), is a 2 member organization of One Treasure Island, and has demonstrated that it is qualified to 3 perform the janitorial and other building maintenance services required by the Authority as set 4 forth in the proposed amendment; and,

WHEREAS, Since October 1, 2004, the Authority has contracted with Toolworks for
 janitorial and other building maintenance services on the former Base, and the current
 contract expires June 30, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, Under the existing Agreement, Toolworks provides annual janitorial services to (i) the Administration Building facility which consist of TIDA's Project Office and all Administration Building occupants, except the US Navy and the San Francisco Police Department; (ii) Buildings 201 (TI Nurses Clinic), 264, and 502 (Childcare Facility); (iii) Mersea Restaurant Bathrooms / Northern Great Lawn Area; (iv) Vista Point / Quarters 9; and (v) Quarters 1-6, in an amount not to exceed \$26,333.33 per month or \$316,000.00 annually for the period commencing July 1, 2022 and expiring on June 30, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, Project Staff and Toolworks have negotiated a First Amendment to the
 Professional Services Agreement (the "First Amendment") that includes expenses related to
 renting the existing restroom trailer facility at Quarters 9 in an amount not to exceed Thirty
 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for the period from October 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023;
 and,

WHEREAS, Compensation for these increased services shall not to exceed the total
amount of \$343,000.00) for Fiscal Year 2022-23 payable as follows: July 1, 2022 through
September 30, 2022 = \$79,000.00 (three (3) monthly payments of \$26,333.33); October 1,
2022 through June 30, 2023 = \$264,000.00 (nine (9) monthly payments of \$29,333.33)
totaling \$343,000.00 for contract services; and,

1 WHEREAS, Under the proposed Amendment, Toolworks will provide routine services 2 to maintain the common areas, restrooms and office suites at the Administration Building, Buildings 201 (TI Nurses Clinic), 264, and 502 (Childcare Facility), Mersea Restaurant 3 4 Bathrooms / Northern Great Lawn Area, Vista Point / Quarters 9, and Quarters 1-6, as well as 5 pay for all expenses related to renting existing restroom trailer facility at Quarters 9; now, 6 therefore be it

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**RESOLVED**, That the Authority hereby finds that Toolworks' mission, purpose, and program is consistent with the Homeless Assistance Agreement; and

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FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Authority hereby authorizes the Treasure Island 10 Director or his designee to execute and deliver the First Amendment, effective October 1, 2022, and expiring on June 30, 2023, for an amount not to exceed three hundred and forty-six 12 thousand dollars (\$343,000.00), in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A; and be 13 it 14

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Treasure 15 Island Director or his designee to enter into any additions, amendments or other modifications 16 to the Agreement that the Treasure Island Director or his designee determines in consultation 17 with the City Attorney are in the best interests of the Authority, that do not materially increase 18 the obligations or liabilities of the Authority, that do not materially reduce the rights of the 19 Authority, and are necessary or advisable to complete the preparation and approval of the 20 Agreement, such determination to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery by 21 the Treasure Island Director or his designee of the documents and any amendments thereto. 22
