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

Public comment is allowed in relation to each agenda item, and the Secretary of the Health Commission will indicate when public comment is to occur for each item when not listed on the agenda below. Each member of the public, whether attending remotely or in person, may address the committee for up to three minutes. Members of the public attending the meeting in person will have an opportunity to provide public comment on every item. In addition to in-person public comment, the LHH JCC will hear up to 20 minutes of remote public comment on each agenda item. The LHH CC will hear remote public comment on each item in the order that commenters add themselves to the queue to comment on the item. Because of the 20-minute time limit, it is possible that not every person in the queue will have an opportunity to provide remote public comment. Remote public comment from people who have received an accommodation due to disability, as explained on page 6, will not count toward the 20-minute limit. Committees of the Health Commission consist of three members of the Commission. If a quorum of the Health Commission is present, it constitutes a Special Meeting of the Commission. If additional commissioners attend the meeting of a committee creating a quorum of the full Health Commission, they may participate in the discussion on an item on the agenda but may not vote with the members of the committee. The committee's recommendations shall be reported to the full Health Commission for discussion and possible action. The Health Commission Secretary shall make a note of the presence of the additional commissioners in the minutes, and discussion shall be limited to items noticed on this agenda.

### INFORMATION REGARDING PROVIDING REMOTE PUBLIC COMMENT FOR THOSE WHO HAVE RECEIVED ACCOMMODATION FOR A DISABILITY FROM THE HEALTH COMMISSION SECRETARY

- Each individual may comment 1 time per agenda item.
- Each individual may speak for up to 3 minutes; after which time the line is automatically silenced.
- To make public comment on a specific agenda item, dial in using the information above, when the item is called.
- Dial “\*3” to be added to the public comment queue for this item.
- When it is your time to speak, you will hear “Your line has been unmuted.”
- Ensure you are in a quiet location.
- Before you speak, mute the sound of any equipment around you including televisions, radios, and computers. It is especially important that you **mute your computer** so there is no echo sound when you speak.
- When the Commission Secretary states, “Next Caller,” you are encouraged to state your name clearly. As soon as you speak, your 3-minute allotment will begin.
- After you speak, you will go back to listening mode. You may stay on the line to provide public comment on another item.
