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Good evening commissioners. We have received 63 3-1-1 complaints since our last commission hearing on February 3rd. I have two short updates tonight, please let me know if you have any questions.

#### **Superbowl LX - Update**

We received 43 311 complaints from February 4<sup>th</sup> through February 8<sup>th</sup>. Overall, events were compliant with permitting requirements and recommended sound levels. We are happy to report a successful Super Bowl LX event weekend.

#### **81 Social Galerie – Noice of Violation**

My next update is about 81 Social Galerie located at 81 Cedar St., who holds a POE and EHP permits with our office. Inspector Jungreis and SFPD visited the business on Sunday, February 1<sup>st</sup> at 2:57am in response to numerous complaints we have received about 81 Social Galerie. During their inspection, they observed one door person onsite who appeared to be checking IDs, however, the business was not adhering to multiple security plan protocols. The permit condition in violation was the following: *"Between the hours of 2am – 6am there shall be at least 2 security guards onsite, and at least one security guard shall be female. Security will perform physical pat downs, check IDs, bag check, and use a metal detector wand on every patron upon entry and reentry into the*

*premises.*” Given that 81 Social Galerie did not have a second security guard onsite, nor did they have a female security guard, nor were they conducting pat downs, bag checks or metal detector wandings of patrons, we issued a Notice of Violation (NOV) for violating the Commission-approved security plan. Additionally, during our visit, we observed people consuming alcohol and smoking cigarettes inside the premises. Neither of these fall under the EC’s purview but since they are not permissible by CA state law, the appropriate regulatory agencies have been notified.
