The Juvenile Probation Department would like to direct your attention to the following slides from the October 2023 Monthly Data Report:

PS Chart 1: Probation Referrals, CARC Intakes, and MIR Referrals (slide 22)

■ There were 65 referrals in October, a 32% decrease from September.

JH Chart 4: Admissions by Primary Reason (slide 18)

There were 26 admissions in October, a 35% decrease from September.

JH Chart 1.2: Average & Peak Population (slide 7)

The average daily population continued its upward trend to 31 young people in October, with a peak of 38 young people.

JH Chart 3.2: Length of Stay for Youth Released (slide 15)

The median LOS for youth released increased in October to 8 days.

PS Chart 5.1: Warrants by Type (slide 39)

- On October 31, there were 52 youth with active warrants, a 37% increase from September.
- Most of the increase in total active warrants was due to an increase in petition warrants.
