As both a Commissioner of the San Francisco Film Commission and Business Agent Secretary of IATSE Local 16, I want to express my strong support for maintaining the Film Commission as a distinct and independent body. The Commission helps ensure that San Francisco continues to attract film, television, and live event productions, which in turn strengthen the city's creative economy and provide stable union jobs.

The Commission's impact is clear. It attracts productions that employ local crews and craftspeople, including camera operators, stagehands, carpenters, and sound technicians. It also gives workers a direct seat at the table so that city policies reflect the realities of our industries. In addition, the Commission delivers tangible economic benefits. Last year, productions generated more than \$17.5 million in direct spending across San Francisco, supporting not only workers but also countless small businesses.

Dissolving or consolidating it now would jeopardize the trust that has been built and undermine the progress made in attracting productions at a time when the city needs them most.
