The Commission is the first city body dedicated to advocating for the protection and well-being of animals, and it serves a unique role by making recommendations and addressing issues affecting companion animals and wildlife in ways that a city department cannot.

Eliminating the Commission would be a huge setback and it would go in the opposite direction of the importance that the world and our society is giving today to the welfare of animals, as living beings that also deserve respect and great care.
