Land Acknowledgement

Special Project Grants

Discussion and possible action to approve recommendations to award two (2) Special Project Grants, to the following organizations and to authorize the Director of Cultural Affairs to enter into grant agreements with each organization for amounts not to exceed the following at this time:

- 1) SOMA Pilipinas Cultural District Support Filipino-American Development Foundation, \$145,000 for 25 months for an arts and culture nonprofit located in the SOMA Pilipinas cultural district that is dedicated to a long-term programming vision for a new narrative focused on culturally relevant placemaking. Funding will be used to support temporary public art, storefront art, arts festivals, art and education programming throughout SOMA Pilipinas, addressing the cultural district's economic recovery and narrative change, or arts and education programming in the geographic area.
- 2) Citywide Night of Ideas Circuit Network, \$120,000 for 31 months for a nonprofit arts and cultural 501(c)(3) organization or fiscally sponsored entity to curate performances for the San Francisco Public Library's Night of Ideas, scheduled for dates in Spring 2026, 2027 and 2028. The organization is responsible for partnering with the SF Public Library to curate approximately six (6) performances for the evening.
