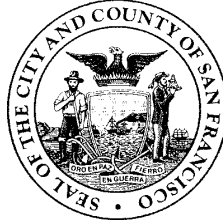

### **Order of Business**

#### **1. Call to Order & Roll Call**

President Parker called the meeting to order at 6:05pm.

Present: President Michelle Parker, Vice President Renita LiVolsi, Commissioner Neil Hallinan, and Commissioner Dena Aslanian-Williams.

Also present: Director of Elections John Arntz, City Attorney Ana Flores, and Commission Secretary Marisa Davis.

Excused Absence: Commissioner Rebecca Bers and Commissioner Trevor McNeil.

President Parker stated the Commission's land acknowledgement of the Ramaytush Ohlone people.

#### **2. General Public Comment**

Tom Slekmán commented on the progress of the SAVE Act in the Senate and his opinion that it includes common sense voter ID provisions that will detect noncitizen voting.

#### **3. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes**

The minutes of the San Francisco Election Commission February 18, 2026 meeting were approved by general consensus of the Commission.

There was no public comment.

#### **4. Director's Reports and Communications**

Director Arntz answered questions about the Ballot Simplification Committee, new instructions for voters regarding manual postmarks, identifying polling places for the June election, and the Accept and Expend request to the Board of Supervisors. He also received positive comments about the full report from Commissioners.

Public Comment:

- George G expressed opposition to mail-in ballots but gratitude for voter guidance in having post offices manually postmark ballots. He also requested that outreach

partner organizations include right-leaning organizations in addition to the current organizations he perceives to be left-leaning.

**5. Panel and Discussion on the Potential Impacts of AI on Elections**

Panelists included:

- Dr. Dédé Tetsubayashi, Founder and CEO of Includu
- Sanmi Koyejo, Assistant Professor at Stanford University
- Tori Noble, Staff Attorney at the Electronic Frontier Foundation

It is one of the commission's aims is to gain a greater understanding of AI's role in elections through educational sessions and outreach initiatives and with alignment with the Department of Election. Panelists all stressed the need for transparency, independent evaluations, and community engagement regarding AI use in elections. They emphasized the need for inclusive practices to protect marginalized communities from AI-generated misinformation and electoral manipulation.

The commissioners appreciated the information and commented that there is far more learning

## **Public Comment Instructions for Remote Participants**

### **When calling in by telephone (preferred):**

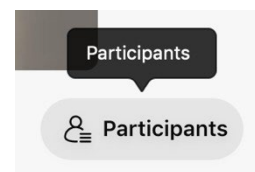
When your item of interest comes up, dial \*3 (star button followed by the number 3) on your phone to raise your hand and be added to the public comment line. You will then hear, "You have raised your hand to ask a question." Please wait until the host calls on you.

The line will be silent as you wait your turn to speak. Ensure you are in a quiet location. Before you speak, mute the sound of any equipment around you, including television, radio, or computer. It is especially important that you mute your computer if you are watching via the web link to prevent feedback and echo when you speak.

If you change your mind and wish to withdraw yourself from the public comment line, press \*3 again. You will hear the system say, "You have lowered your hand."

### **Using your computer web browser (when phone not available)**

Make sure the "Participants" side panel is showing by clicking the "Participants" button shown in the picture at the right.



Then, make sure the "Participants" panel is expanded in the side panel by pressing the small arrow indicator in the panel. You should see a list of Panelists, followed by a list of Attendees. At the bottom of the list of Attendees is a small button or icon that looks like a hand (see where the red arrow is pointing in the picture at the right).

Press the hand icon to raise your hand. The host will unmute you when it is time for you to comment. When you are done with your comment, click the hand icon again to lower your hand.
