The greatest costs are for the staff, youth stipends and overhead which seems more than appropriate for the deliverables outlined.	10	"YOS implements a mixed-methods evaluation approach that balances quantitative metrics with qualitative insights to capture both program outputs and meaningful outcomes. Our data collection system, Apricot, includes attendance tracking at all program sessions, pre/post knowledge assessments for health content, skills-based evaluations for leadership competencies, and documentation of youth-led project reach. These quantitative indicators will be complemented by reflective interviews from youth participants and observational data from program activities." "Quarterly improvement sessions will bring together staff, youth representatives, and community stakeholders to review evaluation data, discuss emerging insights, and collaboratively develop program refinements.
