3rd Street Youth	Overdose Prevention	83	30	3rd Street Youth did an excellent job explaining their organization's mission, history, and track record of impactful programming. They effectively highlighted both past and current accomplishments, demonstrating a strong foundation and proven success in serving youth. Additionally, their extensive list of partnerships strengthens their capacity to meet the diverse needs of the TAY people they serve. One area of concern is the geographic scope of their direct services. The proposal heavily focuses on serving Black and Brown youth in the Bayview, which is certainly an underserved community, however, this may limit the organization's ability to reach other Black and Brown youth across San Francisco who could also benefit from these services. Expanding or clarifying how services are accessible citywide could strengthen the proposal's impact and equity.	13

<p>3rd Street has articulated a clear plan to establish a new overdose prevention and intervention program focused on Black and Brown TAY in BVHP, particularly from justice involved or LGBTQ+ communities. <p>3rd Street Youth clearly laid out the purpose, goals, and intended impact of their program. They included a detailed 12-month plan that shows a strong structure for how the program will be designed and rolled out. Additionally, they detailed inclusivity by serving all TAY youth across San Francisco and offering materials in multiple languages. The only area that could use more detail is the long-term community impact; it wasn't fully explained how the program will create lasting change beyond the initial year. That said, overall, they did well in this section.</p>	13	All key points in this section were well-addressed. The proposal clearly defined the deliverables and measurable outputs, aligning them with the anticipated outcomes outlined in the RFP. The logistical and operational plan was detailed, covering partnerships, staffing, service coordination, and outlining roles and responsibilities effectively. There was a strong emphasis on community-rooted leadership and cultural responsiveness throughout. The only area that could use further development is the identification of specific risk mitigation strategies and contingency plans. Strengthening this component will help ensure greater confidence in the program's ability to maintain continuity in service delivery if challenges arise.	7	All of the requested elements were addressed in this section. The proposal includes a completed budget template and a clear narrative explaining the cost allocations. It outlines how the funds will be used to implement the program while aiming to maintain fiscal responsibility. Additionally, the organization described several partnerships and in-kind contributions intended to enhance program impact. However, the overall budget raises some concerns around feasibility. Specifically, the allocation of only \$5,000 for program materials over a 12-month period appears extremely low and unrealistic, especially given the scope of services being proposed. Even with extensive partnerships, this limited allocation may restrict the ability to deliver high-quality, consistent programming throughout the year. A more detailed justification or adjustment to this line item would strengthen the proposal.	7

Yes, the proposal outlines a thoughtful outreach plan that includes engaging current participants living in the housing program. They intend to involve these individuals through both individual and group sessions, providing them with tools and resources focused on overdose prevention. This approach demonstrates a direct and community-centered engagement strategy. The proposal also goes into detail about various partnerships with community organizations and how these will be leveraged to expand their reach and deepen the program's impact. They addressed accessibility by committing to provide multilingual outreach materials and offering support specifically for LGBTQ+ TAY, which reflects cultural responsiveness and inclusion. However, the proposal did not address disability accommodations, which is a key consideration for accessibility and equity. In addition, while the plan emphasizes immediate engagement, it lacks a clear explanation of how the outreach strategy will foster long-term relationships and sustained trust within the broader community.	10	8	5 Points
		All of the requested components in this section were addressed. The proposal includes a clear plan for tracking, measuring, and reporting key performance metrics such as community engagement, participation levels, and overall program effectiveness. They outlined a solid methodology for collecting and analyzing both qualitative and quantitative data to assess impact and success. Additionally, the proposal describes how community feedback will be used to inform program improvements and support long-term sustainability planning. However, one area that was not fully addressed is how the organization will ensure transparency and accountability in reporting outcomes to the City. While performance metrics were discussed, the proposal would be strengthened by including specific strategies or systems for meeting reporting requirements and maintaining compliance with the RFP’s accountability standards.	5 Points
			Both letters of recommendation effectively highlight the positive impact 3rd Street Youth has on the community they serve. They specifically address the organization's strong engagement with historically marginalized communities and emphasize how 3rd Street Youth create meaningful connections by hiring staff who reflect the backgrounds and lived experiences of the youth they support. This intentional staffing approach further strengthens trust and deepens the program's overall impact.
