Farming Hope's staff have strong hospitality background and cultural competency to ensure their program provides adequate services. The proposal does not include examples of previous successful programs or how their organization ensures leadership and decision-making reflects the needs of community.	8

The purpose of the program is to provide culinary job training, nutritious food access, and food waste recovery. Farming Hope's program helps their graduates develop a sense of purpose as they obtain relevant job skills while serving their community by "feeding" it forward. Another component of their program is to provide dine-in meals and a fresh market grocery store where the food reflects the culture and palates of the communities they serve. The purpose and intended impact are both aligned with the priorities of the Food Justice service area of the RFP. This section of the proposal is missing several components. it does not include information about the engagement strategies, milestones, and timeline for implementation. It also does not state how the program will foster long-term community impact or how it will be accessible and inclusive to diverse groups.		12 The proposal includes a table that details the program deliverables and measurable outputs that are aligned with the RFP. It also includes their logistical and operational plan for each of the program components. The roles and responsibilities of key personnel, partners, or collaborators involved in the service delivery/execution of the program is included in Section A and B. The proposal does not include details on their risk mitigation strategies or contingency plan to ensure continuity.		9 Attachment II is complete and included as table in their proposal document. The proposal includes a clear budget narrative that justifies their cost allocations. All listed funds are within the city's allowable expenses guidelines with the majority of funds going to salary and fringe benefits to ensure the program can be executed adequately. The organization also plans to add an additional evening for dinners which necessitates additional staff. The proposal briefly mentions that their participation in the FAACTS coalition will create opportunities for them to obtain additional resources and/or in-kind donations.	10

The organization has developed relationships with community partners, case managers, social workers, parole officers, conferences/events, and through word of mouth for both their referral and employment recruitment. Many of their clients have limited English proficiency so they have made it a priority to work with multilingual staff and create materials and feedback surveys in different languages. Cultural competency is imbedded in the program design to ensure their offerings are accommodating to their clients needs. The grocery offerings reflect the lived experiences of clients, including apprentices who have recently faced or are currently experiencing homelessness. The proposal does not explicitly state how their outreach strategy will foster trust and long-term relationships but it is implied in their approach and understanding of the needs of the communities they serve.		5 The proposal includes a plan for tracking and measuring the impact of their program but it is not very detailed. The organization plans to collect quantitative and qualitative data using various data collection tools. As part of their methodology they intend to identify indicators of success and conduct both a process and outcome evaluation. The proposal does not include a list of data that will be tracked for the program other than nutrition data. In addition, they do not explain how they will ensure transparency and accountability in reporting outcomes or how community feedback will be incorporated into program improvement or sustainable planning.	5 Points
