The proposal outlines several core components, including an expanded meals program, fresh produce boxes and grocery access, a wellness app, and food literacy/nutrition workshops. The organization presents a comprehensive outreach plan designed to engage community members through personalized engagement, multilingual program materials, faith-based announcements, and peer referrals. Partnerships embedded within the program structure will be leveraged to broaden reach and strengthen impact. These efforts are intended to build awareness and trust among Black/African American residents. While the proposal highlights the availability of program materials in multiple languages, it does not explicitly address other accessibility considerations.

10 The proposal presents a detailed plan for tracking, measuring, and reporting 5 Points on key performance metrics. Core indicators will include reach and engagement, community empowerment and advocacy, program outputs (e.g., number of prepared meals, produce boxes distributed), and outcomes (e.g., improvements in participants' self-reported food security and wellness). Each partner organization has established mechanisms for data collection, and quarterly evaluation reviews will be conducted to analyze findings. To ensure transparency and accountability, Salesforce will be used to generate outcome reports and compile quarterly performance summaries that highlight key metrics, success stories, and challenges. A structured feedback loop will also guide continuous program improvement.
