Requested Action Amendment: No change in scope - term extension - no change to annual funding level											
Purpose: The requested action is the approval of an amendment to the Health Right 360 contract for the provision of Fiscal Intermediary (administrative) support of the San Francisco Street Violence Intervention and Prevention (SFSVIP) program for a term extension of December 31, 2025 to May 17, 2026 (5.5 months) for a total contract amount of \$9,988,788. HR360 receives an indirect rate of 15 percent, so may receive a maximum of \$375k for the provision of these services for the term extension. This program has been previously approved by the Health Commission but needs to be extended to allow more time for transition to another City Department. The responsibility for these services will be transferred to a new City Department, who will resolicit these services to implement a new contract. DPH, however, will retain oversight of the funding allocated for the Bereavement program which supports burials and associated costs for victims of violence \$1,022,573 annually. Approval of the proposed contract amendment serves as the Health Commission's corresponding approval of the use of the Administrative Code Section 21.42, sole source waiver.											
Reason for Funding Change: The Proposed Total Contract Amount with Contingency supports the additional six months of the proposed term.											
Service Description: This contract provides administrative support to operate the San Francisco Street Violence Intervention Program (SFSVIP), a Bereavement fund, and a small Life Coach program under SFSVIP. The purpose of SFSVIP is to support at-risk, highly at-risk, and in-risk systems-involved youth ages 10-30. These youth may receive outreach services, diversion/intervention services, community services or aftercare services as a result of hanging out in known hot spots, being involved in school or community-based altercations, or involvement in violent incidents. HR360 provides fiscal management and human resources support to support the SFSVIP team. This is a collaborative project with close coordination with the DPH and the SFSVIP Program Director. As noted, the Bereavement program supports the burials and associated costs for victims and families of violence.											
Deliverables: This is a cost reimbursement contract. The average hourly rate for all programs is \$72.27.

Requested Action	Amendment: No change in scope - term extension - increase annual funding by CODB only.										
Purpose:	The requested action is the approval of a contract amendment with the Regents of the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) - Vouchers for Veggies EatSF Program to increase the Total Contract Amount with Contingency to an amount of \$6,499,782 and to extend the current contract term from 7/1/2023 through 6/30/2026 (3 years) to 7/1/2023 through 6/30/2028 (5 years). The Health Commission previously approved this contract on November 5th, 2024. This contract provides food vouchers to low income pregnant and post-partum people to reduce nutrition attributable health disparities and improve infant and maternal health services. The annual amount of \$1,218,313 includes an indirect cost of 15% for personnel, 0.94 FTE for staff that manages the program, and operating expenses totaling a cost of \$182,034. The remaining amount of \$1,036,079 will be applied directly to the vouchers. The proposed amendment exercises the options under Administrative Code Section 1.25 - Agreements with Government Entities Ordinance.										
Reason for Funding Change:	The Department is requesting the approval of a Total Contract Amount with Contingency of \$6,499,782, or an increase of \$2,597,782 due to the following changes: (1) an increase in Cost of Doing Business (CDOB) General Fund in the amount of \$12,063 for FY25/26; (2) additional General Fund funding For FY26/27 thru FY27/28 in the amount of \$2,436,626, or \$1,130,987 annually; and (3) an increase in the amount of \$149,093 to the 12% Contingency value applied for FY25/26 thru FY27/28. The current Contingency amount is \$438,593. The previous Contingency amount was \$289,500. Please Note: The annual funding level change is due to an increase of \$12,063 for the Cost of Doing Business (CDOB) in FY25/26.										
Service Description:	Research shows that improved nutrition during pregnancy can reduce stress, support healthier pregnancies, and lower the risk of preterm birth. EatSF provides pregnant WIC and Black Infant Health (BIH) participants in San Francisco with monthly fruit and vegetable or grocery vouchers, helping them afford nutritious foods during a critical time for maternal and infant health. These vouchers are used to purchase fruits and vegetables and other nutritious groceries at a network of over 30 grocery stores and farmers markets in San Francisco. EatSF staff manage the vendor network and provide the vouchers to clients. EatSF vouchers reduce financial barriers to healthy eating for low income pregnant WIC and BIH clients and ensure consistent access to healthy foods. By strengthening food security and supporting healthier birth outcomes, EatSF helps advance health equity for pregnant people in San Francisco.

Purpose:	The requested action is the approval of a contract amendment for continuing services with Public Health Foundation Enterprises, Inc. dba Heluna Health for a Total Contract Amount with Contingency of \$1,374,966 for a contract term of 4/01/2023 through 7/31/2027 (4 years and 4 months). The Health Commission previously approved this contract on March 7th, 2023. This contract provides funding and operational support for the Brief Longitudinal Incident Sentinel Surveillance (BLISS) Project, a public health initiative that will collect data on people who inject drugs (PWID) in Alameda and San Francisco counties. The Public Health Foundation Enterprises, inc. dba Heluna Health will receive annually 15% Indirect cost as their Administrative Fee which equates to \$94,797 with the remaining amount of \$631,982 going to direct services. Approval of the proposed contract amendment serves as the Health Commission's corresponding approval of the use of the Administrative Code Section 21.42, sole source waiver.										
Reason for Funding Change:	The Department is requesting the approval of a Total Contract Amount with Contingency of \$1,374,966, or an increase of \$504,160, due to the following changes: (1) A decrease of \$147,929 in unspent previous National Institute of Health grant funding for the term of 8/1/24 - 7/31/25; (2) A one time carry-forward of unspent National Institute of Health grant funding in the amount of \$251,653 for the term of 8/1/25 - 7/31/26; (3) An additional CDC Federal grant funding in the amount of \$319,625 for the term of 1/1/26 - 5/31/26; (4) An additional National Institute of Health grant funding for in the amount of \$29,635 for the term of 8/1/26 - 7/31/27; and (5) an increase in the amount of \$51,176 to the 12% Contingency value applied for FY25/26 thru FY26/27. Service Description:	Heluna Health, in partnership with DPH's Center for Public Health Research (CPHR), will implement the Brief Longitudinal Incident Sentinel Surveillance (BLISS) Project, a federally funded research initiative supported by the National Institute of Health. The project will establish a new epidemiological data collection system for People Who Inject Drugs (PWID) in San Francisco and Alameda counties using innovative sampling methods to recruit and follow a cohort of 600 participants. Data collected will inform interventions aimed at reducing HIV transmission and addressing health disparities among PWID. Heluna Health will provide staffing, research coordination, and administrative support to ensure successful implementation of the study. The additional CDC funding will help facilitate the ability to determine the population size of people who inject drugs to provide an accurate estimated evidence base to set program targets, measure progress, advocacy, identify unmet health and social needs. This will be achieved through a community-based survey.

Requested Action	Continuing Services in a New Contract - No change in Scope										
Purpose:	The requested action is the approval of a new contract for continuing Program Administration services with the San Francisco Public Health Foundation (SFPH) in the amount of \$7,006,819 which includes a 12% contingency and a term of four years from 01/01/2026 through 12/31/2029 to provide Program Administration services. These contracted services were resolicited and awarded to SFPHF under the category of BHS and SFHN Program Administration Services. SFPHF receives an administrative rate of 15% of total funding, which translates to a maximum of approximately \$200,000 annually. These services have been approved previously by the Health Commission, but under the prior contract.										
Reason for Funding Change:	The Department is requesting the approval of a Total Contract Amount of \$7,006,819 with contingency over 4 years. The prior annual funding amount of \$3,325,904 is presented for comparision purposes, representing the annual funding in the prior contract. As noted, this is a historical contract, and the goal over the past several years has been to transition applicable services into civil service. The services supported under the prior contract were closely reviewed, and as a result, the proposed annual funding represents current and existing services only. Each business owner reduced funding that was no longer applicable to current needs, resulting in the proposed annual funding amount of \$1,560,756.										
Service Description:	The purpose of this contract is to continue existing Program Administration contracts that were provided by a different vendor through 12/31/25, for decades. The Program Administration services are in support of financial management of operational expenses and human resource management, all in support of existing civil service programs, primarily in Behavioral Health Services (BHS), but also including other DPH units. In total there are seven program areas within this contract, of which two will be winding down and ending June 30,2026. The two program areas that are ending Program Administration support include (1) BHS Mental Health Services (billing clerk to support the transition from Avatar to epic) and (2) Jail Health Services (the Jail Health Peers "MAPS" program has ended in its current form). The remaining programs include: three BHS programs, including the Family Mosaic Project and the Parent Training Institute (Children Youth and Family programs) as well as support for the Methadone Van and the Behavioral Health Access Center (SUD programs). Finally, Program Administration services are provided to Whole Person Integrated Care in support of nutritionist services in shelters, and the operating expenses for MCAH's Black Infant Health Program. Under this contract, the contractor will provide timely and accurate financial and annual audit reports, manage/monitor subcontractor performance and provide human resource management for staff specific to accomplishing project goals.
