Requested Action:	Amendment: No change in scope, term extension - Change in Service Level funding (increase or decrease annual funding)										
Purpose:	The requested action is the approval of a contract amendment with the Rafiki Coalition for Health and Wellness to increase the contract amount by \$3,940,121 and to extend the term by two years for a revised term of 7/1/2022 through 6/30/2028. This will continue the provision of community programs and behavioral health services, including individual, family and group sessions.										
Reason for Funding Change:	The Department is requesting an increase of \$3,940,121 to extend the contract for two additional years to June 30, 2028. This contract was previously approved by the San Francisco Health Commission on October, 2, 2022 for \$5,910,572, and for the term of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2026.										
Service Description:	Rafiki Coalition for Health and Wellness (“Rafiki”) provides a culturally affirming, trauma-informed, holistic approach to all ethnicities and populations, with a special focus on the unique cultural and linguistic needs of Black/African American (B/AA) people’s health and well-being to address and decrease health disparities that disproportionately impact this population. Utilizing a culture-specific African American relationship-focused model, Rafiki provides a community-based approach that uses culturally and spiritually affirming activities to engage and promote wellness, strengthen social support networks, reduce isolation, and address and prevent trauma. In addition, Rafiki’s approach increases health literacy, offers health and wellness screenings, provides support for service linkage(s), and increased access to culturally responsive and appropriate services.

Requested Action	Continuing Services in a New Contract - No Change in Scope										
Purpose:	The requested action is the approval of a new contract for continuing services with Facente Consulting for a Total Contract Amount with Contingency of \$1,779,530 for a term of two years seven months from 12/01/2025 thru 6/30/2028. The Health Commission previously approved these services which were provided by Public Health Foundation Enterprises, Inc. dba Heluna Health on June 2, 2025, under Contract ID #1-8917. These specific services were solicited and are authorized under RFP 17-2025.										
Reason for Funding Change:	<p>The Department is requesting the approval of a Total Contract Amount with Contingency of \$1,779,530 due to the following : (1) CDC Federal Grant funding for FY25/26 thru FY27/28 in the amount of \$1,588,866, or \$529,622 annually; and (2) an amount of \$190,664 for the 12% Contingency value applied for FY25/26 thru FY27/28.</p> <p>Note: The previous annual funding is included for comparison purpose. The increase in annual funding is part of the required funding allocation for EHE CAP Grantee Activities, which must be 25% of the total grant award. Current EHE CAP grant award is \$529,000 and at 25%, the amount of \$132,250 should be allocated for these services. However, CHEP is currently \$57,000 short in meeting that requirement and will provide the grantor a justification that will include the reason for that shortage, which is that the \$57,000 is being used to cover DPH staffing FTE.</p>										
Service Description:	Facente Consulting provides program management to the PHD Community Health Equity & Promotion (CHEP) team for Ending the HIV Epidemics (EHE) Community Advisory process (CAP) grantees program evaluation and community needs assessment services. These services will include assessments that will gather information and feedback from stakeholders and community members to help understand community needs around sexual health services. The assessment focus will include: community knowledge and awareness, community access to sexual health services, and community communication preferences. The assessments will be conducted through interviews, surveys, focus groups, Community Advisory Process (CAP) which will be culturally congruent. Facente Consulting will provide data syntheses and reporting that may include partnership collaboration thru subcontracted agencies, consultants or other community-based organizations. These services will support the Health Access Point (HAP) and San Francisco City Clinic programs which aim to eliminate new HIV/STI/HCV acquisitions, HIV-related deaths, and associated stigma within targeted communities disproportionately affected by sexual and substance use-related health disparities.

Requested Action	Continuing Services in a New Contract - No change in Scope										
Purpose:	The requested action is the approval of a new agreement for continuing services with Baker Places for a new contract amount with contingency of \$9,234,318 with a contract term of four years six months from 1/1/2026 - 6/30/2030. The Health Commission previously approved these services on May 2025 through December 31, 2025. The new contract will include the new Ferguson House which will be a Social Rehabilitation Facility licensed by the CA Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) and Medi-Cal certified by the CA Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). This change will expand system capacity for 90-day Mental Health Transitional Treatment by 12 beds, previously with 80 beds, now will have a total of 92 beds.										
Reason for Funding Change:	This program was previously part of Contract ID 1000021574 which ends 12/31/25. There are two programs under the contract which are now separated into two new contracts for ease of management. Additionally, Ferguson Place is currently funded by the State BHSA and County General Fund. The addition of DHCS certification will allow the program to draw Medi-Cal FFP. Thus, there will be no need to spend the County General Fund as the BHSA fund will be used for the matching budget for Medi-Cal FFP. The increase in funding is due to a higher rate for Social Rehabilitation Facility.										
Service Description:	Ferguson House aims to reduce the impact of chemical dependency with a focus on persons living with HIV/AIDS who also struggle with substance use and mental health problems, by successfully implementing a 90-day, structured, residential treatment program for triply diagnosed adults living with HIV and substance use and mental health issues based on a psychosocial rehabilitation model.
