DOSW Mission



OUR HISTORYs

Born out of the Civil Rights movement, the Human Rights Commission was created by City ordinance in 1964 and established as a permanent charter commission via voter approval in 1990.

OUR MANDATE

The City Charter entrusts the HRC to protect and advance civil rights in San Francisco by addressing identity-based discrimination, enforcing anti-discrimination laws, and investigating systemic inequities that impact our communities.

OUR HISTORY

Established in 1975 (the Commission) and 1994 (the Department). Both originated in the women's movement through advocacy by leading feminists and San Francisco voters.

OUR MANDATE


