Chris Clark is a San Francisco-based wave photographer. He refers to his images as "Delicious Salt Bagels", often using the rounded shape of a wave's tube to frame landmarks like the Golden Gate Bridge and Cliff House. Capturing these images while bodysurfing shallow and sometimes heavy shore break, Chris gives viewers a first-person perspective from inside the pocket of a wave. Born a fish out of water with a lifelong connection to the ocean, Chris learned to love bodysurfing as a Junior Lifeguard in the 1980s and began taking pictures from inside waves circa 2010. Headshot of Chris Clark taken by Louis Royer His passion for photography and storytelling evolved alongside a career at GoPro, where he became a skilled user of GoPro products, which are his primary capture tools in the water. In January 2025, Chris began to pursue artistic photography full-time. Today, he offers a range of art, from handmade greeting card prints to large fine art prints of life-size waves for clients' walls. Residing with his family in the outside lands of San Francisco, Chris combines his love for the ocean and San Francisco with an artistic vision to bring fleeting moments in the surf to life.

I plan to sell photo prints of my images I've captured in several forms: framed + unframed prints, premium greeting cards and coasters. I capture the images while bodysurfing at Baker Beach. I have a small home studio with a printer where I print my images on glossy paper. For my cards, I glue the images to high end cardstock, sign and numbered in series's. My largest prints I do at home are 13"x19" and come with chipboard backing and an artist/image bio that is signed. For my framed images, I use frames made from reclaimed wood, sourced from a small family operation near Santa Cruz. My coasters include an image embossed onto a wood block using plant-based resin. All of these products are made at my home.

I've been bodysurfing since I was a kid. And began taking my camera into the water in about 2010. I've learned the craft through the years.
