The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development and the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing will program present updates based on their 2022-2023 budget.

COMMISSIONER COMMENT

<u>Commissioner Aquino:</u> Asked Director Nickolopoulos to clarify if the map in the slide show presentation showed affordable or public housing.

Asked Deputy Director Cohen about details on slide 9 about the community ambassador program will start because they would like to see them on the public transportation and or in the transit stations where people transfer from BART to MUNI trains.

<u>Commissioner Hijazi:</u> Asked about the non-congregate cabin program at 33 Gough, if it was operated by Dignity Moves. She requested the Commission Secretary contact Director Nickolopoulos to schedule a tour. Also asked how many units of affordable housing will open on Treasure Island and when they would open.

<u>Commissioner Pellegrini:</u> Asked Deputy Director Cohen about the 2023-2024 budget information, because the budget will not expand, even though the city has plans to open more homeless and supportive housing during that time. How will the city expand cost saving measures when the cost of baseline services, goods, and utilities are increasing?

Also asked about Prop C funding, with the budget projected to be 45% lower from one year to next? Or does the city assume Prop C revenues will increase the following year?

<u>Commissioner Riley</u> asked about the Area Median Income (AMI) calculations, because they vary from 30% AMI, (\$1030 monthly rent) to an undisclosed percentage, equivalent to \$2050 per month in rent. There will be people who need affordable housing and can't meet the threshold to qualify. She knows families of 4 or 5 living in Single Resident Occupancy Housing and they still don't qualify for affordable housing. Its troubling and we need to accommodate that group of families.

<u>Commissioner Pimentel</u> asked about the design and layout of the cabins.

<u>Chair Clopton</u> asked about the discrepancy between 1000 beds for unsheltered people and the most recent point in time count of 8100 unsheltered people living in San Francisco. Is there a place for everyone and how many temporary beds are available?
