

Bernal Love for Lights along Cortland





What are the biggest challenges you're experiencing and what are the potential solutions?

- Lack of foot traffic since the pandemic, and Amazon's domination of retail purchasing. Hoping to build a vibrant artist community which could draw more visitors and help the businesses that are struggling for customers.
- Empty, unaffordable retail space which is unappealing to visitors. The city could help address problem landlords who are unable to attract and keep tenants due to high rent and regulations.
- Vandalism to business storefronts and break ins, which could be potentially deterred by city funded video cameras.
- Lack of available parking due to Lyft bike rack, multiple loading zones and an unkempt parklet in the central business zone, which could be helped by further SFMTA review
- New construction permit delays, preventing retail from renting store fronts, which could be accelerated by the city.

Are there any additional things that you want the Commission to know about?

- The Bernal Business & Arts Alliance has been waiting for the San Francisco Community Challenge Grants application for over a year now, hoping our organization could be awarded funding for a community arts center.
- The Bernal Heights Neighborhood Center on Cortland is more focused on affordable housing along with senior and youth programs
- BBAA is hoping to build an arts center with rotating gallery shows, retailing local crafts, offering classes in sewing, painting, embroidery and selling tickets for mural walks and culinary tours, all in the effort to attract more tourists and visitors from other Bay Area neighborhoods.
