- 1.0 The meeting was called to order. Roll call found a quorum of committee members were present.
- 2.0 Sworn in Code Advisory Committee Members that were not present at the BIC.

- 3.0 Approval of the minutes of the Code Advisory Committee regular meeting of May 14, 2025.
  - A motion was made to approve the minutes as written.
  - Seconded and approved.
- 4.0 Discussion and possible action regarding proposed ordinance amending the Building, Subdivision, and Administrative Codes to adjust fees charged by the Department of Building Inspection and to establish Sub funds within the Building Inspection Fund. (FILE NO. 250592)

The possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission for further action. Deputy Director, Alex Koskinen & Legislative Affairs Manager, Tate Hanna to walk through the details.

### **Discussion:**

- Fee studies conducted in 2008, 2015 (7% reduction), 2023 & 2024 (raised by 15%) by NBS (consultant) recommended pursuing additional incremental raises using a formulaic approach to recover costs and align with industry standards.
- New fees expected to be effective September 1, 2025; 30 days after Mayor signs the ordinance. Fees proposed ordinance are assumed in department's FY 2025-26 & 2026-27 budget.
- Key community and committee concerns of significant increased fee rates may discourage contractors, homeowners, and developers. May also have negative impacts on construction activity and housing development. Considering communications and public outreach strategy.
- Deputy Director expressed concern that further delaying fee implementation in years to come, may prompt Mayor's office to reject the increase due to negative public perception, potentially resulting in staff layoffs.

### Public Comment:

#### Action:

- A motion was made to approve the ordinance as amended.
  - The motion was approved 8 to 3.
- A motion approved with the condition that any surplus funds stay within the department to
  use these funds before any additional rate increases. Suggestion to stretch the timeline
  from a four-year plan to a six-year plan to get a hundred percent recovery- currently in the
  third year of the four-year plan.

5.0 Discussion and possible action on proposed ordinance amending the Building and Planning Codes to extend the Awning Amnesty Program to apply to existing unpermitted Signs and Gate. (FILE NO. 250539)

Possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission for their further action.

- Background: Instituted Awning Amnesty Program in 2023 to provide streamlined path for existing non-permitted awnings installed on or before August 20,203. Created to reduce submittal requirements and need for professionally prepared plans.
- Applies to existing unpermitted signs in code compliance. AGD & DA Subcommittee discussed and recommended for further action to clarify a code compliant gate with information sheet.

#### Action:

 A motion was made to approve ordinance with amendment requiring department to create information sheet on submittal requirements for gates.

- Background: Mayor's office & City Attorney initiative to remove outdated reporting requirements in line with streamlining efforts. Seven reporting requirements were identified at DBI; they were unnecessary, unused and are time-consuming. Reports requesting to be removed included:
  - General Code Enforcement Activities Report, Residential Hotels Report, Technology Projects updates, Drink Tap Stations, Water bottle refill stations tracking, ADU Authorizations effectiveness report, ADU fee waiver report & Water conservation measures annual report.
