Program Area	Strategy
Grocery Access	Culturally responsive food provided by neighborhood organizations tailored to local community preferences;
D10 Market (Pilot)	Grocery store model offering free food, paired with connection to services; scaled to family size
Meal Support	Supplemental meals for families with young children and adults in need of a hot meal without another option (TL & other high-need areas)
Grocery Vouchers	Vouchers to purchase groceries at grocery stores and farmers market across the City; centering choice and healthy food access for low-income households
Food Production	Urban farms that provide freshly grown produce to low- income households in the community, while training BIPOC youth as apprentices


