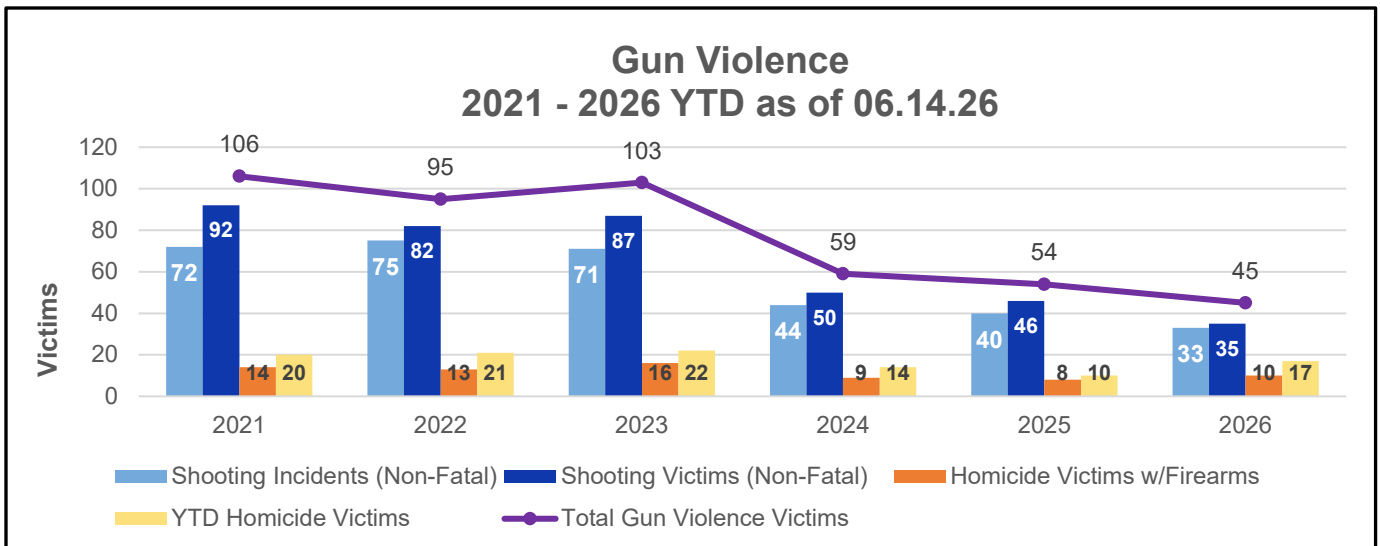
GUN VIOLENCE – CITYWIDE

GUN VIOLENCE: Total gun violence is DOWN 17% compared to 2025

- There were no shooting incidents causing injuries the week ending 06.14.26
 - There is a total of 41 fatal/non-fatal shooting incidents resulting in 45 victims; 10 homicides, 35 non-fatal

TOTAL HOMICIDES: Homicides are UP 70% compared to 2025

- **There were NO homicide incidents reported the week ending 06.14.26**
 - There are 17 homicides YTD with 10 resulting from a firearm.
 - There are no homicides in June 2026
 - **Overall Clearance Rate for 2026: 112%**

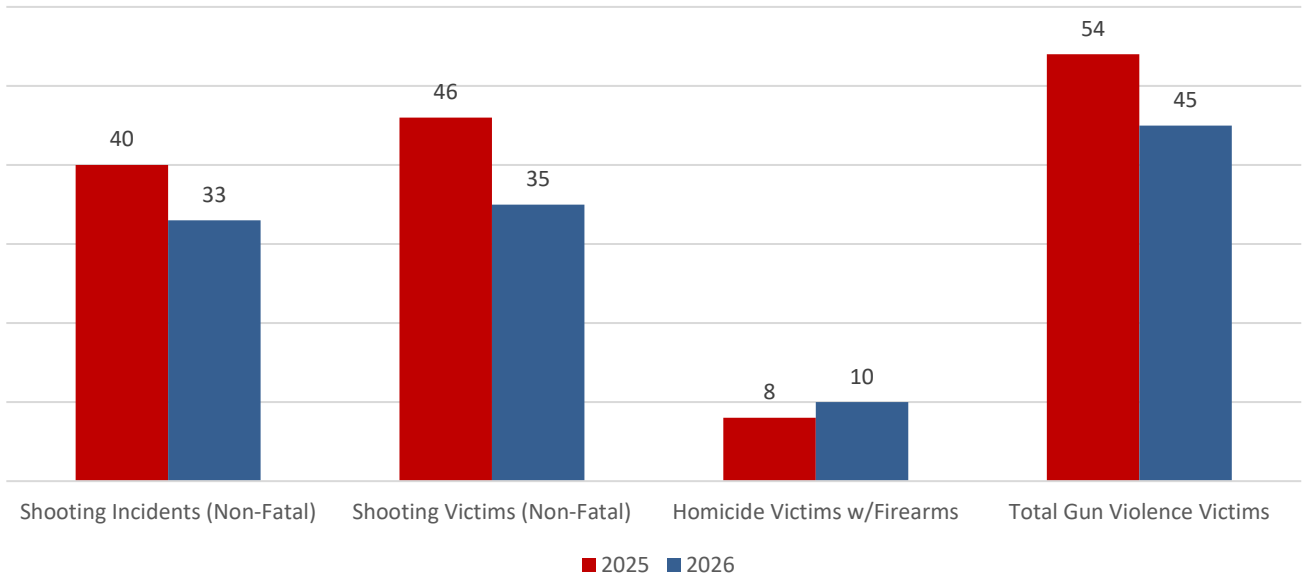

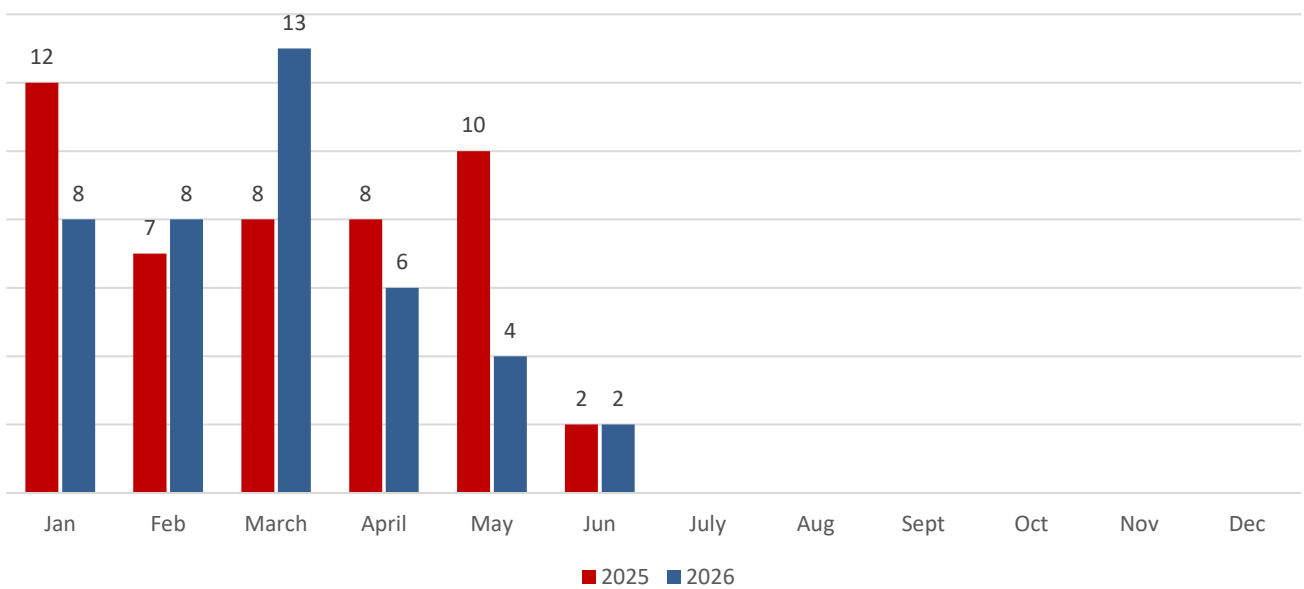

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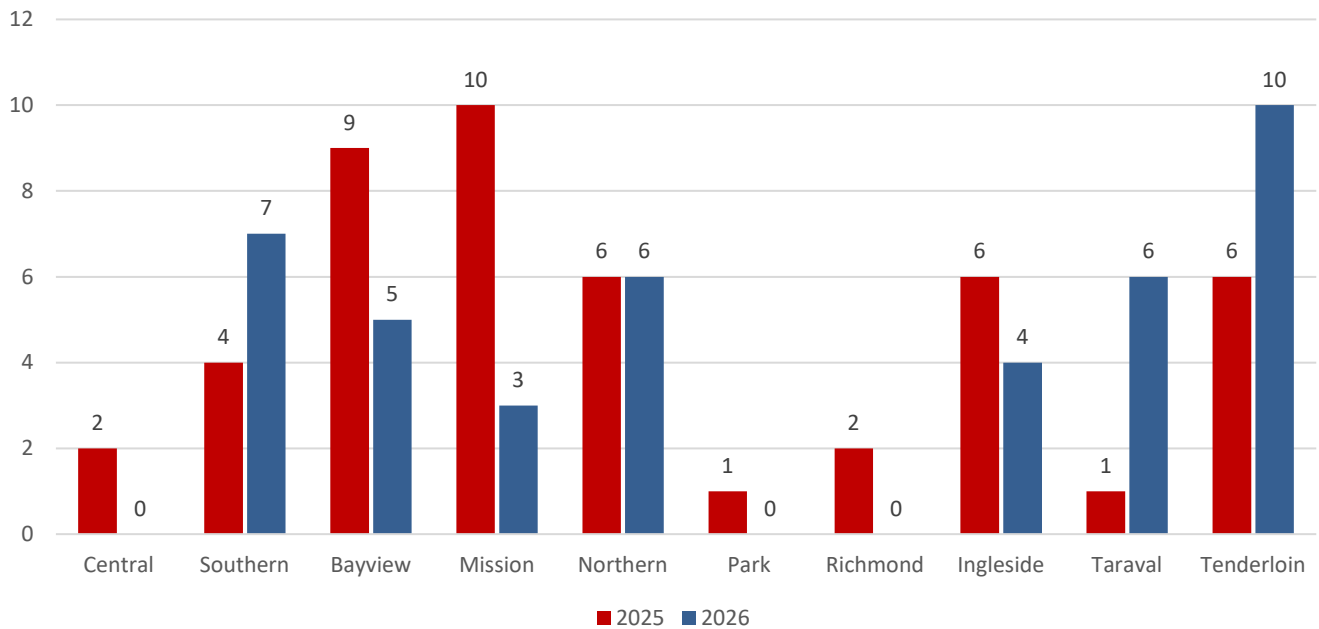
Gun Violence 2025 vs 2026 YTD



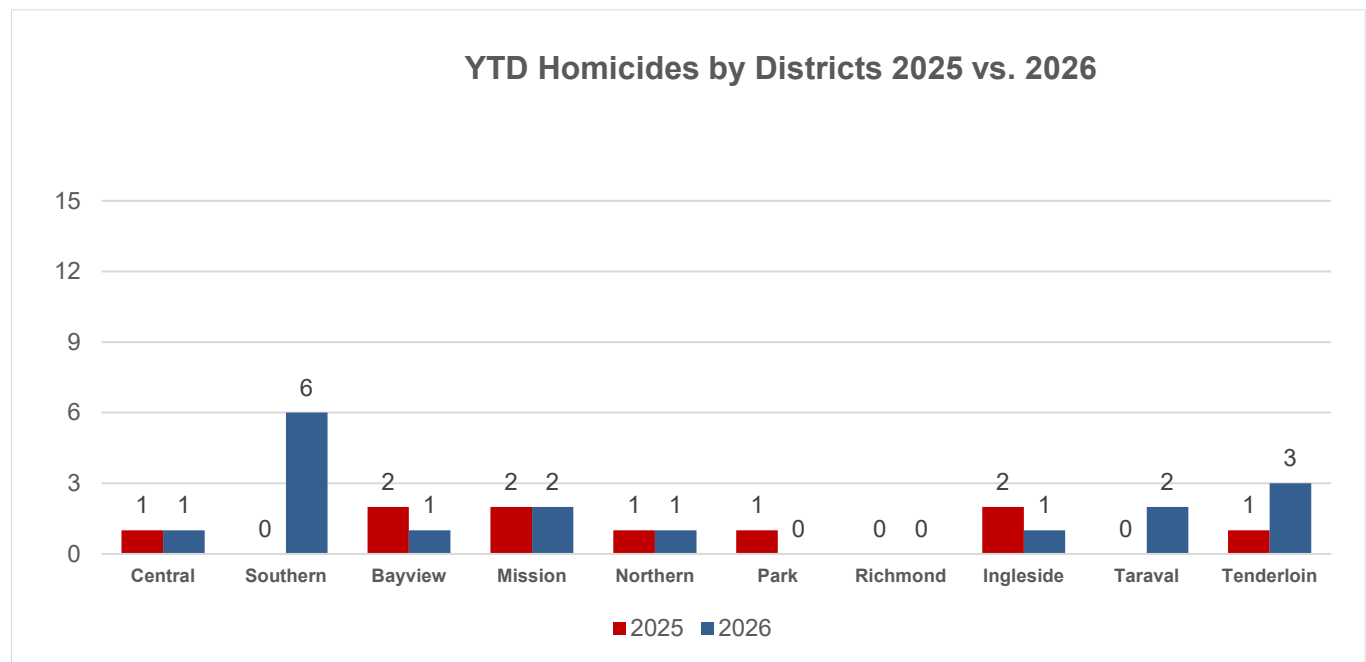
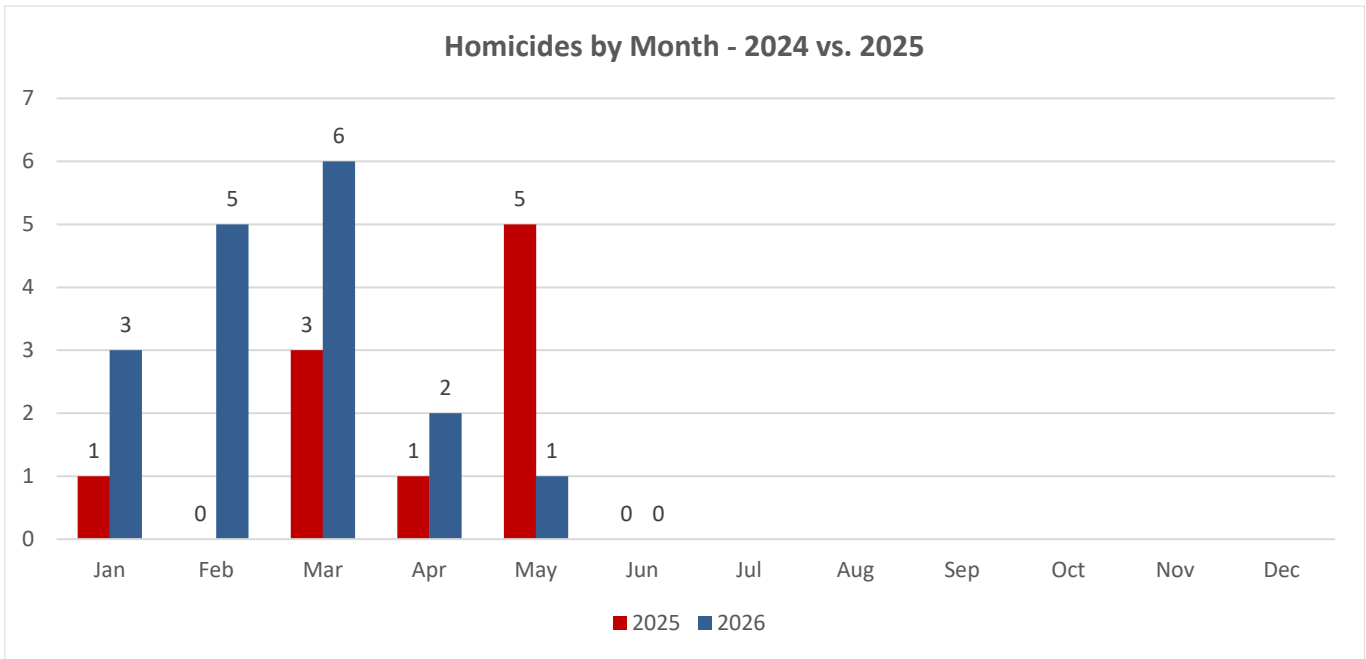
Shootings YTD - By Month - 2025 vs. 2026
