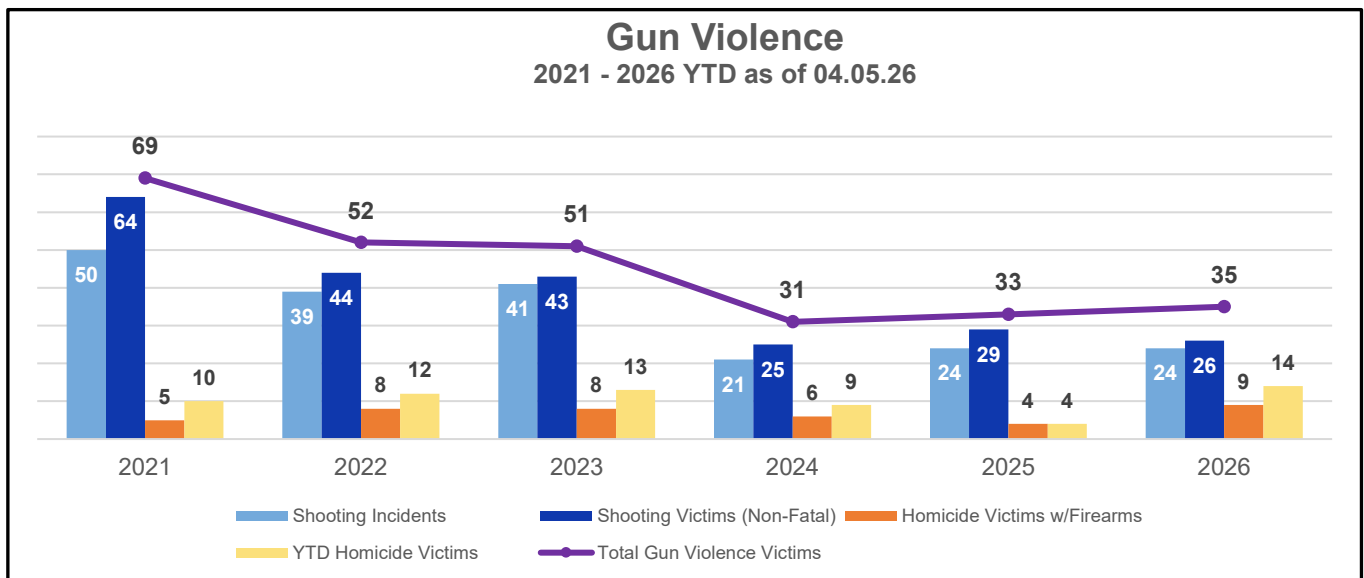
GUN VIOLENCE – CITYWIDE

GUN VIOLENCE: Total gun violence is UP 6% compared to 2025

- There were 2 shooting incidents causing injuries to 2 victim the week ending 04.05.26
 - There is a total of 31 fatal/non-fatal shooting incidents resulting in 35 victims; 9 homicides, 26 non-fatal

TOTAL HOMICIDES: Homicides are UP 250% compared to 2025

- There were **NO** homicide incidents reported the week ending 04.05.26
 - There are 14 homicides YTD with 9 resulting from a firearm.
 - There are no homicides in April 2026
 - **Overall Clearance Rate for 2026: 107%**

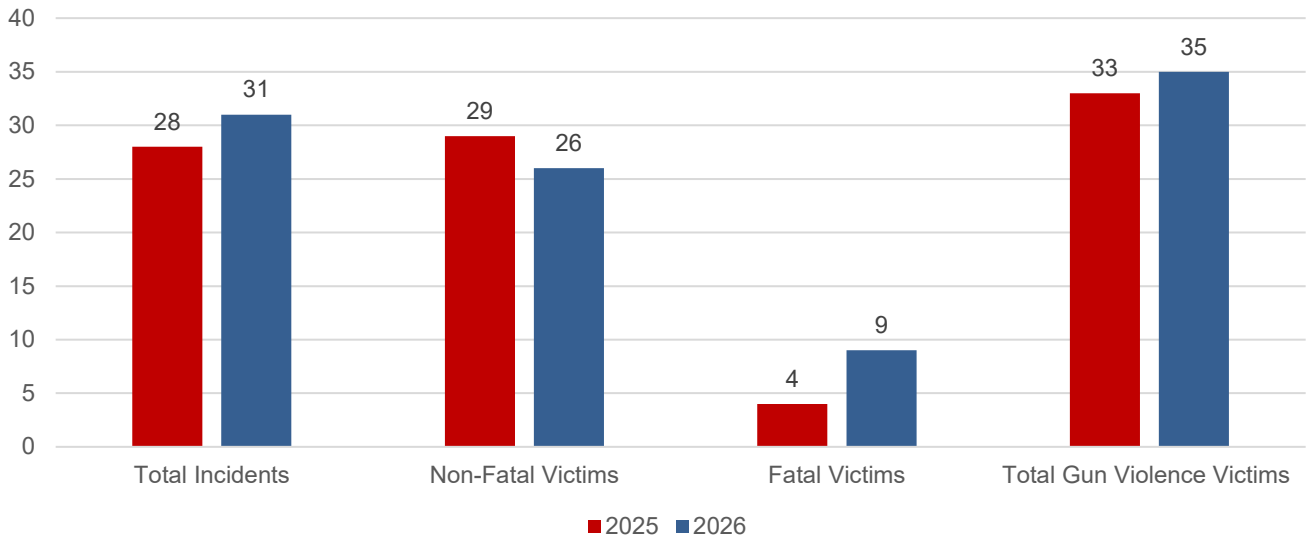

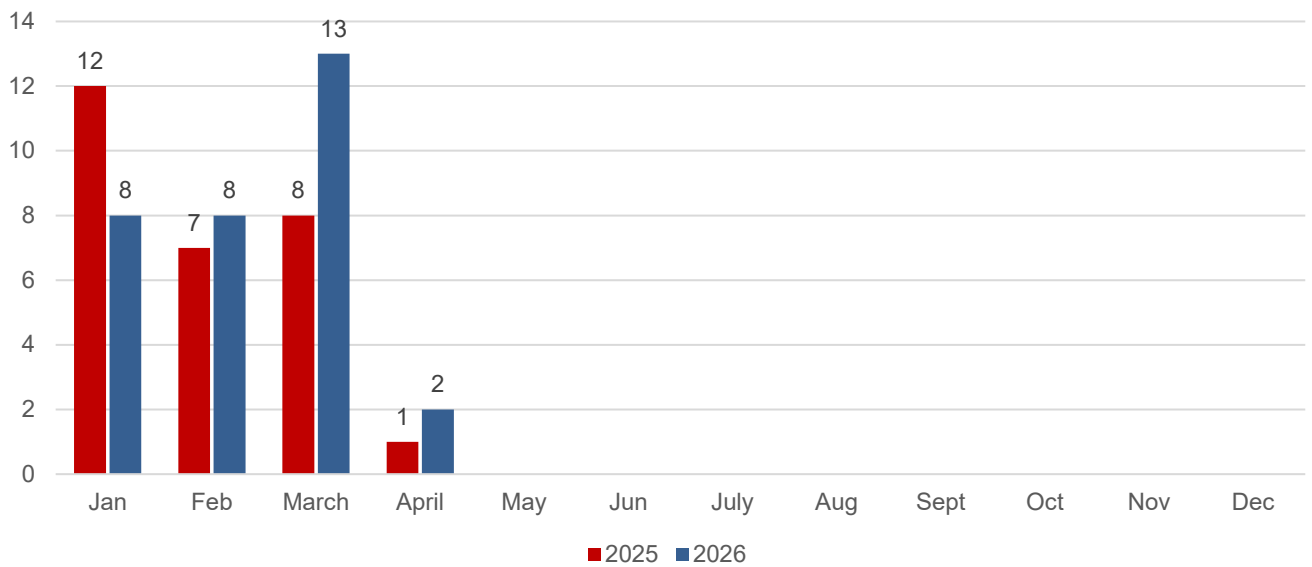

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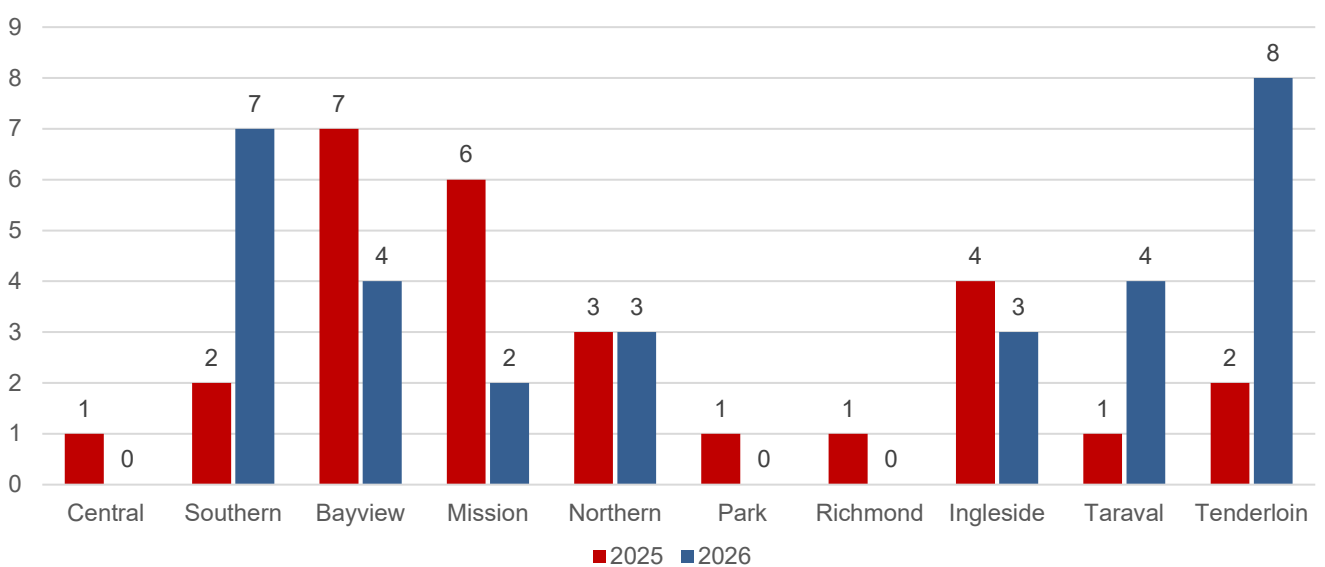
Gun Violence YTD Comparison 2025 vs. 2026



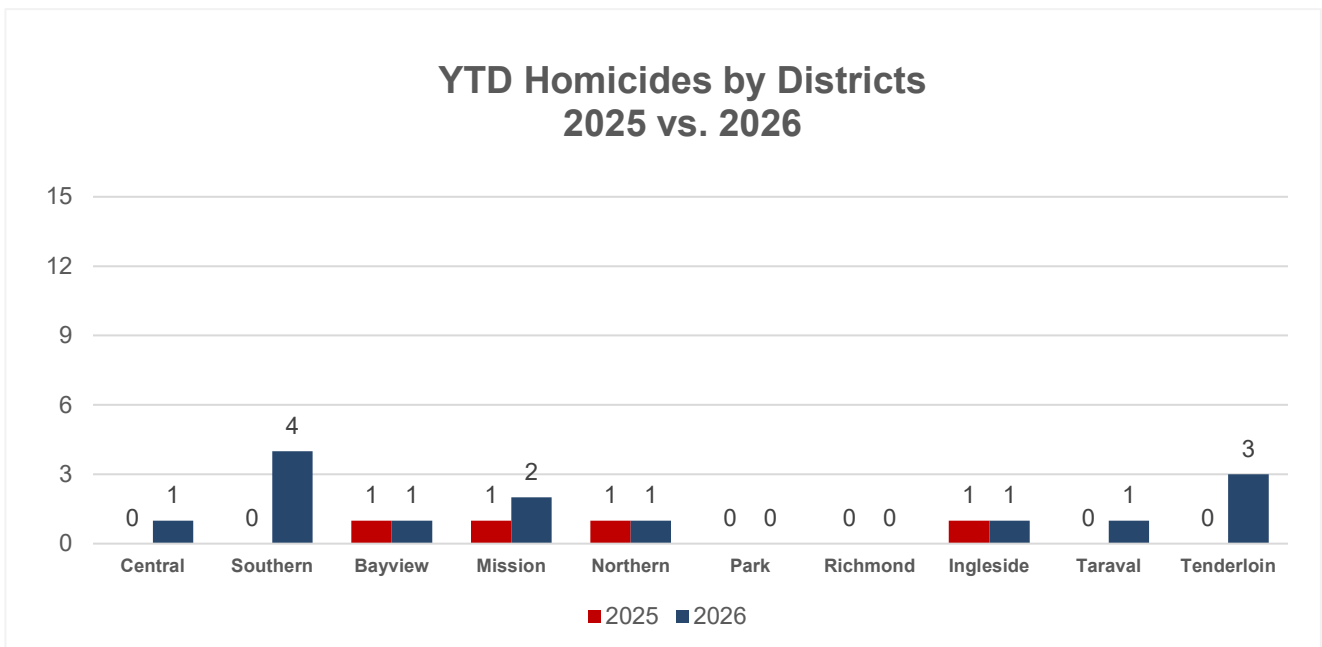
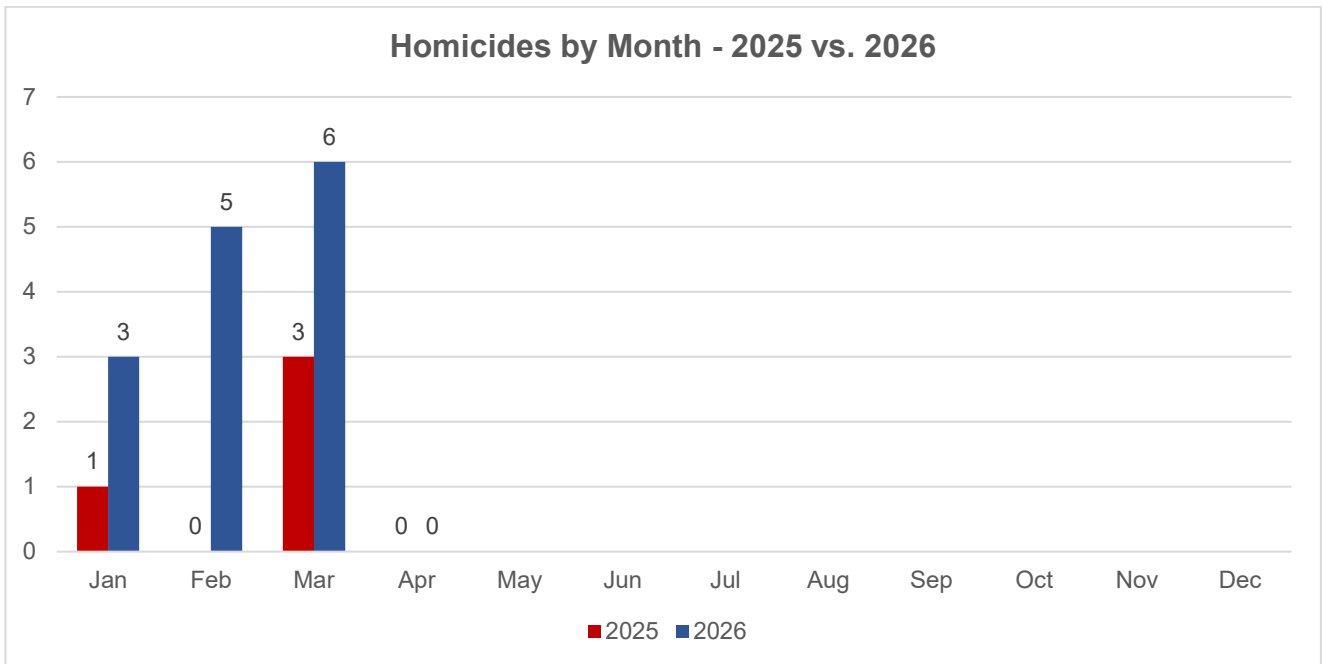
Shootings YTD - By Month - 2025 vs. 2026
