#### Fall 2023

- Continued implementation of programming, including the establishment of Secure Commitment Providers Advisory Board

#### Winter 2023/24

- Implemented physical improvements to the facility, as recommended by and reflected through DJJ Realignment planning process
- Continued reentry planning efforts
- Secure Commitment Provider Advisory Board meeting regularly

#### Spring/Summer 2024

- Reviewed, approved, and submitted 2024 DJJ Realignment Plan submission to OYCR
- DCYF Awards Announced
  - DCYF RFP incorporates DJJ Realignment Subcommittee vision into 5-year grant cycle
- Reentry Planning Workgroup completed work
- Issued Reentry Housing Solicitations

#### Fall/Winter 2024

- DCYF grants awarded, implementing programs
- Reentry Planning Workgroup recommendations presented to subcommittee at December meeting
- Reentry Services RFP issued
- Ongoing physical and programmatic improvements to SYTF

#### Spring 2025

- Reentry Services grants awarded
- Submitted new, fully updated DJJ Realignment Plan
- Rolled out new SYTF Behavioral Development Program
- Ongoing physical and programmatic improvements to SYTF

# DJJ Realignment Subcommittee: Timeline of Accomplishments

#### Fall 2025

- Reentry Services providing support to SYTF youth
- CTE Urban Agriculture Program launched
- SYTF Behavioral Development Program in full swing
- Identifying Less Restrictive Program Housing in SF and across California

#### Winter 2025/2026

- Continue refining new CTE program
- Roll out Behavioral Development Program to full facility
- Identify Less Restrictive Program Housing in SF and across California

#### Spring 2026

- Submit updated DJJ
   Realignment Plan to OYCR,
   including LRP descriptions and expenditures
- Identify Less Restrictive Program Housing in SF and across California

### Current San Francisco DJJ Realignment Population

- Probation Caseload:
  - 74 youth have prior sustained 707(b) petitions (27.5% of total probation caseload, excluding AB12)
- Secure Youth Treatment Facility (SYTF) Commitments
  - 2021 to Date: 17 young people have been committed to San Francisco's SYTF
  - Currently in SYTF: 10 young people currently in SYTF
    - Base Term Range: 2-7 years
  - Less Restrictive Program (LRP): 2 young people currently in an LRP
- Juvenile Hall Commitments w/ 707(b) Offenses
  - 2021 to Date: 5 young people have been committed to San Francisco Juvenile Hall w/ 707(b) offenses
  - Currently in Juvenile Hall Commitment w/ 707(b) Offenses: 0
  - 1 young person currently on probation after discharge from Juvenile Hall commitment

## Programmatic Updates

- Reentry Services providers currently supporting young people in and out of custody
  - Sunset Youth Services & Sharp Circle
  - Description of services
    - Reentry Coordinator & Intensive Reentry Case Manager(s)
    - Build Early Relationships
    - Assess and Plan for Reentry
    - Provide Direct Support & Resource Coordination
    - Relentless and Intensive Post-Release Engagement
    - Skill Building & Systems Navigation
    - Emotional & Social Reintegration
    - Innovative Reacclimation
    - Collaboration & Accountability

## Programmatic Updates

- First County Office of Education Career Technical Education (CTE)
   cohort in session
  - Urban Agriculture
  - Culinary Arts
- Continue to identify Less Restrictive Programs for SYTF youth to step down to
  - Working with two LRPs in LA County to support young people who want to step down in Southern California

## Programmatic Updates

- Implementing Furloughs
  - Developing policy that allows SYTF youth to furlough with varying levels of supervision
- Financial Justice Project
  - Working with San Francisco Treasurer's Office Financial Empowerment Project to open bank accounts, check credit, build credit for all SYTF Youth
  - Offering intensive financial counseling to all SYTF youth as they prepare for reentry and after release

## Girls in SF Juvenile Justice System

- Girls represent 23% of JPD's total active caseload
  - 63% Black/African American
  - 28% Latinx
  - 9% AAPI, White, or Other
- 16% of girls on JPD's caseload have a prior sustained 707(b) offense
- To date, no girls have been ordered to Secure Youth Treatment Facility Commitment or Juvenile Hall commitment for a 707(b) offense.

### Dispositions for Girls in DJJ Realignment Population

- Dispositions for girls in San Francisco with sustained 707(b) offenses:
  - Home on probation
  - Out of home placements, such as Resource Families (RFAs) or Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Placements (STRTPs)
- Other dispositions for girls in other counties with 707(b) offenses include:
  - Ranches or camps
  - Juvenile Hall/Secure Detention Commitments
  - SYTFs, where they sleep on a female unit, but program with male SYTF youth throughout the day
