



 - Transitional Workflow, Interagency Agreements, Onboarding, Training



 Use of Force – Injury or Death Use of Weapon or Control Device Sexual Misconduct Pattern/Practice–Retaliation/Harassment/ Bias Reckless Disregard – Health or Safety 	All complaints
Additional misconduct at SFSO discretion	No limitation on additional misconduct
All in-custody deaths	All in-custody deaths
Recommend investigative findings only	Recommend findings & disciplinary action
No subpoena power to conduct hearings	Subpoena power
Access to information by agreement	Requires cooperation


Cases Opened Q2 2025




Cases Closed Q2 2025



Cases Pending Q2 2025




