## Summary for June 10, 2026

The Department of Police Accountability's highlights for the week:

- DPA staff attended the Mayor's City Hall Pride Flag Raising and 2026 Juneteenth Kickoff.
- DPA has started preliminary conversations with the Real Estate Division about a move to 1455 Market Street, following Board of Supervisors' approval.
- DPA will be presenting our Budget to the Board of Supervisors on June 12th.

## Investigation Updates:

### ◆ **Statistics Since the Last Police Commission Meeting (June 3, 2026):**

- **Cases Opened:** 18
- **Cases Closed:** 17
- Year-to-Date Comparison:
  - The volume of incoming complaints continues to rise and is approximately 17% higher than for the same period last year.
  - The number of cases past 270 days is currently 6 and all are tolled, which continues to be a historic low.

Most Common Allegations Received Since the Last Commission Meeting.

Allegation Type	Allegation Summary	Percent
Conduct Unbecoming	The officer behaved or spoke inappropriately.	31%
Neglect of Duty	The officer failed to take required action.	25%
Neglect of Duty	The officer drove a city vehicle in a grossly negligent or reckless manner.	13%
Neglect of Duty	The officer failed to properly investigate.	6%
Use of Force	The officer used unnecessary or excessive force.	6%
