Summary for June 3, 2026

The Department of Police Accountability's highlights for the week:

- On Monday morning, June 1, shortly after midnight and within an hour of notification, DPA's on-call team arrived at the location of the officer-involved shooting at Bayshore Boulevard and Jerrold Avenue to initiate its investigation.
- DPA's audit of the San Francisco Police Department's compliance with requirements regarding the use of Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) systems is underway. Last week, DPA held an entrance conference with SFPD to discuss the audit's scope, objectives, and project timeline.
- DPA staff visited the Taraval, Northern, Mission and Park Stations to discuss the department's mediation program.
- In April, DPA staff spoke to the newly graduated 287th Recruit Class at the academy, sharing an overview of DPA'S mission and mandate.
- In May, DPA staff attended the SFPD Crisis Intervention Team Awards Ceremony.

Investigation Updates:

◆ **Statistics Since the Last Police Commission Meeting (April 8, 2026):**

- **Cases Opened:** 155
- **Cases Closed:** 122
- Year-to-Date Comparison:
 - The volume of incoming complaints continues to rise and is now approximately 18% higher than for the same period last year.
 - The number of cases past 270 days is currently 6 and all are tolled. This is a historic low.

Conduct Unbecoming	The officer behaved or spoke inappropriately.	24%
Neglect of Duty	The officer failed to take required action.	10%

Use of Force	The officer used unnecessary or excessive force.	8%
Neglect of Duty	The officer failed to properly investigate.	5%
Conduct Unbecoming	The officer displayed threatening, intimidating, or harassing behavior.	5%
