Administrative Code is already challenging...and Chapter 14B has a drafting issue common to many laws.

The next few slides will dissect the issue and discuss a solution.

# 1. What is the LBE certification size threshold (when is a firm a micro vs a small vs. an SBA) in a category?

#### **Chapter 14B** states:

Category	Micro-LBE	Small-LBE	SBA-LBE
Public works/Construction	\$12,000,000	\$24,000,000	\$40,000,000



However, the Controller is required under Chapter 14B.3 to increase these values every five years. The Controller issued the memo effective January 1, 2025. These correct and accurate values live in the memo and are not reflected in Chapter 14B.

Today you could research 14B, cite the code, and be wrong.

## 2. When does an SBA-firm receive a bid discount/rating bonus?

#### Chapter 14B.7(D) says

SBA-LBEs shall apply only to Contracts (other than Commodities Contracts) with an estimated cost of no less than \$400,000 and no greater than \$20,000,000, and to Commodities Contracts with an estimated cost of no less than \$400,000 and no greater than \$10,000,000.



In 2010 the SBA bid discount was added to the ordinance and \$400,000 was the Minimum Threshold Amount.

The Minimum Threshold has been increased four times since 2010 -- 2015, 2020, 2022, and 2025.

As the Administrative Code evolved, this number remained fixed. \$400,000 is now another (confusing) threshold un-linked from the legislative intentions.

## 3. Does 14B use the Prop Q/Delegated Departmental spending amount?

Yes! ... and No!

A "Prop Q" or "delegated departmental spending" allows for a simple and expedited process for purchasing commodities and general services. Construction and professional services are not allowed in this method.

<u>Chapter 14B</u> doesn't use the term "Prop Q" or "delegated departmental spending," but uses the concept of Prop Q as a baseline number for Chapter 14B.

\$10,000, the Prop Q amount from ~1999-2024, is mentioned 22 times in Chapter 14B.



The Purchaser is responsible for determining the delegated purchasing amount.

The Purchaser increased the maximum Prop Q threshold amount on July 1, 2024.

Chapter 21 has evolved, 14B has not.

# 4. When the Chapter 6 and Chapter 21 Thresholds and LBE categories are updated (as required by code), what happens?

Every 5 years the Controller writes <u>an internal memo</u> to City Staff to update the (1) Chapter 6 and 21 Thresholds and (2) LBE category sizes by inflation, using the Consumer Price Index.



While the numbers are updated, the Code remains static until there is an Ordinance to reflect the change.

Only an insider will understand that the Code has outdated numbers

## The 14B Legislation Drafting Concern:

- Code was drafted to be "hard coded" with numbers rather than concepts
- Some parts of the Code evolve while others do not. This results in confusing and incomplete implementation of legislative intent
- ☼ Chapter 14B numbers do not reflect the Controller's updated numbers. This is not transparent for the public
- Solution Strates an unnecessary (self imposed) barrier for the public and City employees in following the Administrative Code

#### Improving 14B – Potential Solution


If the LBEAC concurs, CMD Director recommends a limited and targeted "search and replace" Ordinance update to Chapter 14B to:

- ✓ Add the concept of "delegated purchasing amount"
- ✓ Update the CMD category numbers
- ✓ Update the SBA bid discount amount to reflect original legislative attempt.

This is not a policy change. This is good government work to do clean-up. These changes are limited to correct confusing and incorrect areas of the code.





## CMD Delivers: System Decommissioned

CMD has decommissioned the LBE certification database. It was designed in the 1990s.

CMD and the Office of the Controller (CON) started the transition as part of the 2017 FSP/Peoplesoft financial system implementation. This picked up momentum in 2023 and the legacy system was decommissioned on March 17, 2025.

To ensure an excellent transition, CMD CON did extensive data reviews. **All firms are listed in the Directory!** 

We did an internal audit to ensure all firms have a contact, email, address etc. 6% of firms require additional minor corrections. 90/0
Speed for LBE letters last two weeks compared to previous year.


