CMD in 2025

Highlighted Impact of 14B

- Newly designed **Annual Report** clearly presents the impact of the LBE program, what the departments achieved, and the extent of Micro-LBE participation

Broadened Pathways

- Launched the **TIDA Mentor Protégé Program**

Certification Improvements

- **LBE Directory** was updated to include supervisor district, credit restrictions, EB status
- **LBE certification letters** were redesigned and delivery expedited
- Decommissioned the certification database from the 1990's

- Improved **flexibility of the Code** for future modernization, aligning terminology

Timely Notifications for LBEs

- Included a “How To” on **Early Release of retention** in all pre-construction meetings and notices

Resolution amending the City's 10-year capital expenditure plan for fiscal years 2026-2025 to amend the proposed government obligation bond program.

**G.O. Bonds – ESER
File [251216](#)**

Ordinance to call a special election on June 2, asking voters to approve up to \$535 million in bonds to pay for earthquake and safety projects. The funds would be used to build, repair, retrofit ESER facilities.

Inspector General

Alexandra “Alex” Shepard began serving as San Francisco Inspector General in January 2026.

- New role approved by voters under [Proposition C](#)
- Prevent, detect, and investigate fraud, waste, and abuse by city employees, city officials, and those doing business with the City.
- Investigate abuse or conflicts of interest related to contracts.
- Investigate Whistleblower complaints.
- Make recommendations regarding laws or policies that impact public integrity.
- Has subpoena and warrant powers.
