Item 4.0 Commissioners reviewed the draft list of site visits and presentations for the 2024-25 Report. It was noted that the Office of Overdose Preventions October 2024 presentation was not included in the list and would be added. There was a focus on ensuring no duplication of

site visits or presentations from previous years e.g., 2023-24. It was noted that technical issues, audio problems, and lack of quorum had prevented some planned presentations in spring of 2025.

Item 5.0 Programs discussed for inclusion: Westside Crisis, Behavioral Health Access. Health Right 360, Friendship House, Lyric Youth Services, San Francisco Community Health Center, Larkin Youth Services and school Based Behavioral Health Services. Commissioners emphasized the need to include programs serving youth, transgendered individuals and marginalized children particularly those affected by Covid- related issues. The importance of hearing from school-based social workers and case workers was highlighted, as these professionals witness firsthand the challenges faced by vulnerable students.

It was also discussed including presentations from jail behavioral health programs and care court were proposed siding recent issues with issues, such as lack of hot water and overcrowding. The homeless children's network was identified as a challenging but important partner for future presentations.

Motion to accept updates the draft of the goals and plans for 2024 -25 by Commissioner Stevens and seconded by Commissioner Williams.
