Dear President Clay,

I wanted to share with you my gratitude to Officer Navarro and the SFPD team who took care of my engagement ring when it was lost in the most unbelievable and unlikely of events!

I somehow dropped my engagement ring in the mission district, where I live near SFGH. As a last ditch effort (and with no actual hope), I posted in my neighborhood asking for neighbors to look out for my ring and text if they found it. I realized my ring was lost on Jan 19 and by last week I was convinced I would never see it again.

But a neighbor texted me saying they had found my ring more than a week earlier and had turned it into the Mission precinct.

On Saturday, I went down to the Mission office and the officer looked through the evidence files and found that yes the ring had been turned in, had a case number for it, and sent me down to 850 Bryant.

On Monday, I recovered my ring from the evidence room at 850—a tale no one can believe!!

I am certain that at least one of your officers thought “this ring is never going to be claimed” and could have cut corners or not followed the steps. But they didn’t—and because of their professionalism and follow-through and commitment to process... I was able to locate it and be reunited. They were also very professional and thorough in checking my paperwork to prove ownership! I’ve included a picture of me with my ring from the 850 basement!

I just want to share this story and express my gratitude. No one can ever replacement their engagement ring... and now I have two amazing stories to accompany my ring: the story of my engagement and marriage, and how the SFPD saved my ring!
