Chief's Report

- **Weekly crime trends**
- **Major/Significant Incidents**

Chief Lew then reported on crime trends YTD: Violent Crime down 26 percent; homicide, 6 YTD; rape down 14 percent; robbery down 33 percent; assault down 25 percent; human trafficking up 25 percent. Property Crimes down 35 percent; burglary down 43 percent; motor vehicle theft down 39 percent; arson down 39 percent; larceny theft down 32 percent. Gun violence is down 11 percent compared to 2025. There were 4 non-fatal shooting incidents causing injuries to 4 victims for the week ending 2/15/2026.

Shooting Incidents: On February 9, 2026, at approximately 0400 hours, in the 1700 block of Mission, officers responded and located a victim with gunshot wounds. There is no arrest in this case, and it is an open investigation. On February 14, 2026, at approximately 1:15 a.m., in the 1200 block of Polk, officers responded to a shooting call and found a victim in serious condition. There is no arrest in this case, and it is an open investigation. On February 15, 2026, at approximately 4:43 a.m., at 5th and Welsh in the Southern, officers responded and located a victim suffering from gunshot wound was transported in critical condition. There is no arrest and is an open investigation. Also on February 15, 2026, at 0627 hours, in the 1200 block of Buchanan, a victim self-transported to the hospital with a gunshot wound. Victim did not provide any information. There is no arrest and is an open investigation.

Homicide Incidents: On February 9, 2026, in the Southern, officers responded in the area of Harrison and 2nd Street and located a victim. Despite life-saving efforts, the victim was declared deceased at the hospital. There is no arrest and is an open investigation. On February 11, 2026, at approximately 8:55 a.m., at the 100 block of Turk, officers responded regarding a shooting and located a victim who was declared deceased on scene. An arrest was made and is still an open investigation.

Significant Arrests: On February 12, 2026, a male subject entered a bank on the 300 block of California Street and demanded money from an employee. It was a failed attempt and the subject fled from the bank. Responding officers searched the area with negative results. On February 13th, the Department received a report that another male subject entered a business on the unit block of Montgomery Street and threatened staff member. Officers recognized the subject from the previous attempted bank robbery. Officers located the suspect on 4th Street and took him into custody.

MAJOR EVENTS: Chief Lew reported that there are currently 74 recruit officers in the academy and another class starting on March 2nd. On February 17th, there was a lateral class graduation that consisted of 9 laterals, 3 special events officers, and 1 reserve officer.


