Dear Vahe-

I am directing our Fiscal Team to pay the invoice amount \$2,845,611, which we received from you on 7/3/19. I can see that you have sufficient expenses to justify the full invoice amount. As I've noted in previous invoice though, I do believe that there may be cases counted in your total that are incorrect and don't match the methodology document that I know that Aliya worked on extensively with your colleagues. While this doesn't affect our payment of your invoice, this impacts your calculation of the total costs incurred by the college.

We've talked about materiality in the past, and I get that these amounts are relatively small. But seeing rows that aren't easily explainable can be disconcerting for someone trying to ensure that billings are accurate. In the new MOU though, there will be an external auditor reviewing these documents, and I want to be sure that Free City is successful in such a review; thus, I am flagging these issues again now.

Just as a quick error check example, if you look at the \$500 Grant Tab, if you filter billing units in column D for less than 12, there are 43 cases where BILLING UNIT is under 12, quite a few of those cases don't seem correct at first glance and at minimum bring up follow-up questions. While some may be related to drops, that very first row 66 appears to be someone who was only registered for 6.5 units, yet the stipend appeared to be \$250. I've screenshotted this example below at the end of this message. Similar confusing rows show up in other tabs like the \$200 Grant Tab.

I know that the program design may be changing, and City College shares the City's interest in cleaner documentation. If DCYF is able to carve out the time, we may be able to do some more detailed analysis of the problems we see and summarize them so that they are inventoried and can inform our design going forward with the new MOU, but the issues are quite similar to the questions we have raised in the past. Either way, let's make sure when we enter the new MOU that we have clear reporting requirements that City College will be able to follow through its reporting infrastructure.


