






Strategic priorities

- State-of-the-art STI and HIV treatment, prevention, and care
- Equitable access to services and community outreach
- Conducting research to advance the science of sexual health
- Provider education and training
- Continuous quality improvement
- Supporting staff and multidisciplinary collaboration
- Financial sustainability and billing improvement



Center of excellence for sexual health: A syndemic approach



Services uniquely offered at SF City Clinic



- On-site moderate complexity CLIA laboratory with point of care lab diagnosis
- Same day STI treatment for specific infections
- Collaboration w Public Health Lab, development specialized diagnostic testing.
- On-site LINCS team for partner services and care navigation
- Expert consultation on complex STI cases to providers throughout San Francisco



Advancing equity in sexual health at SF City Clinic

- Diverse staff
- Serve all San Franciscans, regardless of ability to pay
- Care and patient education in multiple languages
- Prioritize persons most at risk for STI, HIV
- Community outreach and partnering
- Explicit goal of increasing % of SFCC patients who are persons of color.







In 2024, SF City Clinic saw

- 6,157 individual patients
- 12,060 visits

Black/African-American and Hispanic/Latine persons, who experience the highest STI rates, are disproportionately represented among SF City patients relative to their share of the SF population.

Clinical innovations in 2024-2025

- Preparing to launch long-acting reversible contraception to our reproductive health services by the end of 2025
- Hepatitis C treatment program
- Expanded Hepatitis B screening and vaccination program
- Responding to threat of antibiotic resistance in STIs




Biomedical prevention program

- Pre- and post- exposure prophylaxis for HIV (PrEP and PEP)
- Doxycycline PEP to prevent bacterial STIs
- Prioritize access for men who have sex with men (MSM), Trans persons, uninsured or publicly insured
- Low barrier access to cutting edge prevention



Rapid implementation of highly effective new PrEP Option

- Lenacapavir (LEN) approved June 2025
- 2 injections/year
- Available through Medi-Cal, Patientassistance, commercial insurance
- August 1^{st:} we screened a patient previously identified as being ideal for this intervention
 - Struggled with oral medication
 - Difficulty with 2-month visits
- August 6th Initiated LEN 6 weeks after FDA approval






Patients in SF City Clinic PrEP program

- 1,132 enrolled as of Q2 2025
- 48% of our current patients are Latine or Black/African American.
- 52% are on medi-cal or uninsured receiving medication through a patient assistance program.

SF City Clinic has started 5,123 persons on PrEP since 2014




10% of persons enrolled in PrEP at SF City Clinic are taking long-acting injectable PrEP

Training the next generation of sexual health leaders

- Clinical Training Program: Medical students, nurse practitioner students, medical residents, infectious disease fellows
- Hands-on experience in STI/HIV diagnosis, treatment, prevention
- Collaborations with the California Prevention Training Center (CAPTC)
- Program prioritizes inclusive, stigma-free care and supports diverse clinical learners from across the area
- **4**5 trainees in 2024-2025

SF City Clinic diagnoses and treats 10% of HIV/STI in San Francisco

Diagnosis (2024)	Citywide N	SF City Clinic N	% diagnosed at City Clinic
Chlamydia	4219	277	6.6%
Gonorrhea	4811	585	12.2%
Early Syphilis	493	57	11.6%
HIV	145*	15	10%
