



SF COVID cases per 100,000 residents





Cumulative COVID Cases and Deaths: SF






Reproductive Rate Still Under 1.0



Effective Reproduction Number



Vaccinations by Race/Ethnicity: Full Vaccine Series





GROUP 1 – RECOMMENDED

- 65 and older
- 18 and older in long-term care settings
- 50-64 with underlying medical conditions or at increased risk of social inequities (including communities of color and others at risk of inequities)

If you are a part of this group and feel that you should receive a Pfizer booster dose, discuss your individual risks and benefits with your health care provider.

Additionally, your health care provider/system can offer you a Pfizer booster dose; please contact them to make an appointment.

GROUP 2 – MAY BENEFIT

- 18-49 with underlying medical conditions
- 18-64 at increased risk of Covid-19 exposure due to occupational or institutional setting, such as:

First responders

Healthcare workers, firefighters, police, congregate care staff

Education staff

Teachers, support staff, daycare workers

Food and agriculture workers

Manufacturing workers

Corrections workers

U.S. Postal Service workers

Public transit workers

Grocery store workers





Bay Area Health Officers agreed that a county may lift its indoor masking requirement when ALL of the following occur:

- 1. County is in CDC moderate (yellow) tier for at least 3 weeks, AND
- 2. COVID-19 hospitalizations are low and stable, AND
- 3. Either 80% of the jurisdiction's total population is fully vaccinated, OR
- 4. 8 weeks have passed since COVID-19 vaccine has been authorized for 5–11-year-old children.

These metrics are shared for Bay Area counties, but each county may meet criteria at different times.







Indoor masking requirements lifted as of October 15 in limited settings, including:

• Offices, gyms, and fitness centers, employee commuter vehicles, religious gatherings, and indoor college classes or other organized gatherings of individuals who meet regularly, not exceeding 100 people.

In order for individuals to remove masks in these settings, employer/host should:

- Control access to the setting,
- Verify 100% full vaccination,
- Ensure proper ventilation,
- Ensure no recent COVID-19 outbreaks, and
- No children under 12 and guests are present

Indoor masking remains in effect for all settings accessed by the wider public, including:

- Retail stores and other shared indoor areas such as common areas of a building elevators, lobbies and restrooms
- Bars and restaurants except for patrons while actively eating or drinking

CDPH requires indoor face coverings in healthcare facilities, public transit, adult/senior care facilities, schools and childcare.

• SF will still abide by the State's requirements for indoor face coverings in these settings







Summary and Looking Ahead

- Sustain efforts to respond to future surges
- Adapt systems to endemic COVID
- Vaccines: Boosters, 5–11-year-olds, primary dose hesitant
- Ongoing priorities: Schools, congregate living facilities such as skilled nursing facilities/LTCFs, shelters and jail, and the communities most disproportionately affected by COVID
