This Agreement is for the provision of direct treatment/services that serves as an extension of DPH's service delivery system.

*DPH only pays for filled beds. For the past year, DPH clients occupied an average of 21 beds - 15 beds at Garfield Neuro Ctr. and 6 beds at Morton Bakar. As clients move in and out, we expect to have 21 unduplicated clients at these two facilities.

**These two facilities have a Tier System of Care; clients may progress from a lower level of care to a higher level of care depending on the clients' needs, diagnosis and acuity. SNF3, SNF4, SNF BH represent additional services, including 1:1 sitters, patient escorts and bed holds.

Purpose of Agreement:

Morton Bakar Center (Morton Bakar) provides a longer-term recovery program within a supportive, structured, and secure inpatient environment designed to help residents prepare to move to the community and/or lower levels of care. Morton Bakar provides 24-hour nursing care and specialized staff that work within a collaborative recovery environment based on Recovery-Centered Clinical System (RCCS) model. Morton Bakar specializes in long-term care for adults with impairments such as organic brain syndrome (OBS), traumatic brain injury, dementia, developmental disability, and other neurological conditions.

San Francisco residents admitted to Morton Bakar Center (MBC), a Special Treatment Program (STP), Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) will be 65 years of age and above with a primary diagnosis of severe mental illness.

Garfield Neurobehavioral Center (Garfield) program integrates medical, mental health and behavioral treatment. Garfield's multi-disciplinary team includes nursing, rehab activities, social services, a Psychiatrist, a Nurse Practitioner, a Physician Assistant, a Clinical Director (Psychologist) and a Behavioral Specialist. Garfield is not licensed to provide Special Treatment Program (STP) services because facility residents have primary diagnoses of neurobehavioral disorders. Instead, the on-site Behavioral Specialist assists residents to manage their

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behaviors appropriately, learn skills to maximize their independence and to improve their overall quality of life. Rehab staff supervises structured groups and activities which help residents receive assistance and redirection throughout their day to have success and prevent incidents and related injuries.

San Francisco residents admitted to Garfield Neurobehavioral Center, Skilled Nursing Facility will be 18 years of age and above with a primary diagnosis of neurobehavioral illness (brain injury, cognitive impairment or dementia related to mental illness) and LPS Conserved or Probate Conserved with San Francisco's Health and Human Services (HSA), Department of Disability and Aging Services (DAS).

Please note: This vendor was previously managed under the HR360 check writing contract. To improve contract administration, monitoring, and overall oversight, we are transitioning to a standalone contract directly with the vendor.

Monitoring Report/Program Review & Follow-up:

This Agreement will receive annual monitoring through the DPH Business Office of Contract Compliance (BOCC), including for performance and fiscal stability.
