#### **Purpose of Agreement:**

The proposed agreement with Westside Community Mental Health Center is awarded under the 21B Core Initiatives (Fentanyl Ordinance) as a new program, Westside Clubhouse, an Evidence Based Practice for people with Serious Mental Illness that builds community to reduce social isolation and empowers individuals to pursue new opportunities with confidence. These services were previously designed to serve individuals with Serious Mental Illness (SMI) and were supported through private donations. DPH has asked Westside to adapt the Mental Health (MH) Clubhouse model in order to serve clients on Methadone making the Westside Clubhouse the first in the nation to adapt this MH evidence-based practice for people with Substance Use Disorders

This project supports the expansion of a Clubhouse operated by Westside Community Services to include both individuals living with Serious Mental Illnesses (SMIs) and Substance Use Disorders (SUDs). It should be noted that while private donations supporting services to individuals with SMI has ceased, the services to this population are ongoing and this larger presence serves to bolster community supports and connection.

The Clubhouse strives to provide a supportive environment where members can form meaningful social connections and take on responsibilities that enhance their sense of purpose including life, education, and job skills. The program aims to minimize social isolation for clients receiving medication treatment for their substance use disorder by fostering peer-to-peer support networks and promoting recovery.

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The Clubhouse offers a variety of activities that support individuals with SMIs and SUDs, including cooking, gardening, and vocational training to prepare them for employment and volunteer opportunities. All programs will be client-led, with guidance and support from Clubhouse staff.

#### **Monitoring Report/Program Review & Follow-up:**

**Listing of Executive Director and Board of Directors:** 

This Agreement will receive annual monitoring through the DPH Business Office of Contract Compliance (BOCC), including performance and fiscal stability. Westside Clubhouse will submit monthly reports, including the following, and DPH will monitor their performance regularly.

- Number of clients enrolled in the Westside Clubhouse as new members
- Number of client visits to the Westside Clubhouse by all potential and new members
- Number of potential clients met during outreach visits to the Westside methadone program
- Monthly calendar of activities available at the Westside Clubhouse
- Quarterly reports on how client's Clubhouse experience affects their quality-of-life measures, done via member interviews and surveys, administered by Atlas Clarity, an independent, third-party organization who develops, implements, and evaluates the Clubhouse's client longitudinal outcomes.
