


# SF COVID cases per 100,000 residents




#### COVID+ Cases per 100,000 Population (7-day Average)




#### **COVID Cases and Deaths**






# **COVID** Deaths by Month





### Case Rates by Vaccination Status



## Booster Recipients by Age




All residents with a vaccine booster

#### Summary



- Indication of SF COVID case rate stabilization.
  - Hospitalization capacity remains adequate.
- Additional boosters likely to be recommended this fall.
- Bay Area Health Officers stress the importance of taking safety precautions as the region experiences an increase in COVID cases:
  - Keep masks handy with well-fitted N95/KN95s/KF94s). Bay Area Health Officers urge the use of high-quality masks indoors.
  - Keep a supply of rapid test kits on hand.
  - Stay up to date on your vaccinations including the primary series and boosters, when eligible.
  - Plan ahead for a possible infection. You may need an isolation plan, a child-care plan, or a work plan.
  - Know how to reach a doctor. *Ask your provider now about antiviral treatment* if you were to test positive and are at risk for severe illness.
