Task Order (TO) Award






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Parcel G Building Demolition TO Award

This TO award marks progress in the HPNS cleanup to support future land transfer and redevelopment


- On April 23, 2025, ECC Infrastructure LLC, headquartered in Burlingame, CA, was awarded the Parcel G Demo task order
- ECC and the Navy conducted a post award kick-off meeting on May 08, 2025, and are now executing the 8-month workplan phase

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Parcel G Building Demolition Process

- All work plans will require approval by State and Federal Regulators before any work begins
- Asbestos, lead-based paint, and other hazardous materials will be removed first
- Buildings will be taken down using excavators, shears and other heavy equipment in a precise, controlled manner

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Parcel G Building Demolition Process

- All material will be sent out of state for disposal
- Concrete and metal will be recycled
- All trucks will be scanned for radiation prior to leaving HPNS
- An air monitoring program with real-time and analytical sampling will be implemented as part of the dust mitigation process during all active work



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Task Order – Organizational Responsibilities

- NAVFAC BRAC Defines the project requirements such as the 23% requirements for local business subcontracting and D-10 resident hiring
- NAVFAC Southwest Managed the award of the task order
- NAVFAC Southwest/Resident Officer in Charge of Construction (ROICC)
 Office Responsible for TO management and compliance monitoring of meeting the 23% requirements
- ECC Responsible for meeting the 23% requirements and implementation

Parcel G TO: Subcontracting Opportunities

ECC and its subcontractors are working together to meet the project's 23% local subcontracting requirement and identified a range of opportunities for local businesses

- Local businesses opportunities still needed:
 - Janitorial Services
 - Electrical Power Drop/Hookups
 - o Equipment Rental
 - Long haul trucking of hazardous wastes
 - Site Trailers, Porta-Johns, Wash Stations
 - Geotechnical Testing Services
 - Stormwater/Erosion Control/BMP Suppliers
 - Safety Equipment
 - Traffic Control Equipment







Parcel G TO: Biggest Need is Trucking

Independent long-haul local truckers and trucking firms have opportunities to support out-of-state transport for the project:

- o Drivers must be Class A Commercial Drivers License (CDL) licensed with a clean and valid driving record and comply with all DOT regulations
- o Hazardous material hauling, both Driver and Truck must possess the appropriate HazMat Endorsements
- o Trucking companies must meet all applicable US DOT requirements, including possessing valid identification numbers and licenses
- All necessary state and local government licenses must be maintained
- o Companies are required to have out-of-state trip and fuel permits or International Fuel Tax Association (IFTA) documentation





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Parcel G Building Demolition Task Order Requirements


ECC will ensure the 23% metrics are achieved based on:

- 1. 23% of project subcontracted work to businesses located in zip codes 94107, 94124, and 94134
 - The amount of local work subcontracted \$\$ value to businesses
 within the 3 approved zip codes will be validated by the Navy
- 2. 23% of site labor will be comprised of local-residents
 - The site labor goal will be validated via weekly certified payrolls/labor reports from our subcontractors checking employee zip codes

Parcel G TO: Outreach & Engagement


ECC is connecting with local D-10 residents and organizations to create pathways for participation

- Pre-registration of local contractors started in May 2024
- Hosted an informational & signup booth at the HPSCAC Business & Employment (B&E) meeting on September 11, 2024
- Commitment to attend three CAC Meetings annually, starting with the July 17, 2025 meeting
- Attending the September 18, 2025 CAC Meeting
- Planning a Career and Subcontractor Opportunities Fair on November 20, 2025 to connect local businesses and residents
- Community engagement will continue throughout the project to ensure transparency and accountability

Parcel G TO: How to Register with SAM

IF YOUR COMPANY IS NOT REGISTERED WITH SAM (WWW.SAM.GOV), YOU WILL NEED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. You must have a valid postal physical address that has a zip plus four digital postal code; e.g., 96913-1234
- Tax identification Number (TIN) or Employer Identification Number (EIN) assigned by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) or Social Security Number assigned by the Social Security Administration (SSA) if you are registering as a sole proprietor

Not required for non-US registrants

- 3. You will need statistical information about your business, such as:
 - · Average number of employees
 - · Average annual receipts
- 4. Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) information *Not required for non-US registrants*
- Notarized letter with designation of company/ administrator entity



After obtaining these key items, you may begin registration by accessing SAM at www.sam.gov

Once the online registration is completed, it can take 3 to 5 days to become activated. SAM will email you a confirmation, and provide you with a CAGE Code,

Remember to re-validate your registration at least once every 12 months or it will become inactive.
