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HCH Program Overview



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- SFDPH's Health Care for the Homeless program's goal is to provide high quality health care in multiple clinics and programs for people experiencing homelessness.
- The federal definition of experiencing homelessness for this grant includes people who are:
 - Living outdoors, in vehicles, or in structures not intended to be housing
 - Staying in a shelter
 - Staying with a friend or family member (other than with a parent or child)
 - Currently residing in a treatment or transitional program
 - Living in a Single Room Occupancy hotel without tenancy rights
 - Experiencing any of the above eligible housing categories in the past twelve months

HCH Program Scope



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- SFDPH has 34 locations included in the Health Care for the Homeless grant scope
 - Locations are a mix of primary care, urgent care, school-based, and shelter-based sites
 - All are outpatient, and some are located on the ZSFG hospital campus
- All visits to these locations attended by people experiencing homelessness are considered part of the HCH grant scope. Visits are considered part of the grant program for both insured and uninsured clients.
- The cost in 2022 to deliver all HCH scope outpatient visits was \$12,732,553, of which the HCH grant covered \$1,150,854
