


Staff Recommend Eliminating 31 Inactive Policy Bodies from Code

- On June 13, staff identified 34 inactive policy bodies
- Generally, inactive bodies do not add value for San Francisco residents
- Staff contacted City departments to gather more information on each of these inactive bodies
- After further investigation, staff recommend eliminating 31 of these and deferring decision-making on 3





Next Steps for Elimination

- Today: the Task Force may discuss and vote to eliminate any inactive bodies
 - If the Task Force recommends any bodies for elimination,
 the City Attorney's Office will prepare draft legislation
 removing them from code
 - The Task Force may amend its decisions at any time before the final legislation is approved
- February 4 (tentative): review draft legislation
- February 18 (tentative): vote on draft legislation
- By March 1: legislation introduced to the Board of Supervisors



Several Bodies May Follow Different Processes for Removal

- Three inactive bodies are already targeted for removal via parallel processes
 - The Street Design Review Committee and the Workforce Development Advisory
 Committee are both proposed for elimination in a draft ordinance before the Board of Supervisors
 - The Public Utilities Commission is currently developing an ordinance to remove the Industrial Waste Review Board from the Public Works Code
- The **Permit Prioritization Task Force** can only be eliminated via a special process that involves supermajority approval of both the Board of Supervisors (8/11 votes) and Ethics Commission (4/5 votes)

Staff Recommend Deferring Decision-making on 3 Bodies

If the Task Force agrees, these bodies will be revisited in future meetings, where they may be kept, modified, consolidated, or eliminated

Name	Rationale for Deferral	Proposed Future Meeting
Board of Examiners	Fulfills an important appeals function but has only met once since 2020. May be required to meet more frequently by potential future state legislation. More time needed to assess. Recommend waiting until Task Force finalizes evaluation criteria and templates.	October 1 – Housing and Economic Development
Long Term Care Coordinating Council	Voted to disband in 2024 but has a Charter duty to make appointments to the Dignity Fund Oversight and Advisory Committee. Recommend discussing both bodies together in the same meeting.	October 15 – Public Health and Wellbeing
Our Children, Our Families Council	Contradictory evidence in favor of keeping and eliminating. Recommend waiting until Task Force finalizes evaluation criteria and templates.	October 15 – Public Health and Wellbeing
